# URBAN SHIELD

- Urban Shield is a continuous, 48-hour Full Scale Multi-Disciplinary Homeland Security/Disaster Preparedness Exercise hosted by the Alameda County Sheriff's Office, with the support of the Bay Area Urban Area Security Initiative (UASI), and more than 150 local, state, federal, international and private sector partners.
- First responders are presented with exercise scenarios that incorporate key elements of real-world emergencies and major critical incidents at various scenario sites in Alameda, San Francisco, San Mateo and Santa Clara counties.
- An Incident Command System (ICS) structure—with ten Area Commands, Medical Checkpoints, and a Department Operations Center (DOC)—will be implemented to manage the multi-location and multi-discipline full-scale exercise for Urban Shield 2013.



# URBAN SHIELD


- The overarching goals of Urban Shield are to provide a multi-layered training exercise to enhance the skills and abilities of regional first responders, as well as those responsible for coordinating and managing large scale events. This exercise is designed to identify and stretch regional resources to their limits, test core capabilities, while expanding regional collaboration and building positive relationships. In addition, this exercise provides increased local business and critical infrastructure collaboration.
- In 2013 Urban Shield will become the vehicle to validate the Regional Catastrophic Preparedness Grant Program's (RCPGP) Mass Fatality and Volunteer Management Plans (more plans to be exercised in future years)
- Urban Shield 2013 will operate under the principals of the National Incident Management System (NIMS), Standardized Emergency Management System (SEMS) and the Incident Command System (ICS) structure. Regional emergency management personnel will control the exercise utilizing the Emergency Operation Centers and mobile command posts throughout the region. Alameda County OHSES will serve as the Department Operations Center (DOC).



# **RISK OVERVIEW ASSESSMENT**

- Law enforcement, fire, Emergency Operations Center (EOC) and EMS personnel, representing agencies throughout the Bay Area UASI Region, will participate in some, or all, of the realistic scenarios. Their capabilities and equipment will be evaluated by related experts, in order to provide an accurate regional assessment that result in a meaningful Gap Analysis, After Action Report (AAR) and Improvement Plan.
- Urban Shield follows the Homeland Security Exercise and Evaluation Program (HSEEP) methodology.
- Urban Shield is used as a mechanism to develop and maintain the tracking of regional assets so that we verify their location, level of readiness and capability to improve regional preparedness.

## NATIONAL PREPAREDNESS POLICY TRANSITION

- Homeland Security Presidential Directive 8 National Preparedness (2003)
  - 2007 National Preparedness Guidelines
    - 37 Target Capabilities that were extremely detailed
- Presidential Policy Directive 8 National Preparedness (2011)
  - **2011 National Preparedness Goal:** A secure and resilient Nation with the capabilities required across the whole community to prevent, protect against, mitigate, respond to, and recover from the threats and hazards that pose the greatest risk.
    - 31 Core Capabilities that are very high level



# **CORE CAPABILITIES PURPOSE**

- The National Preparedness Goal states that the Core Capabilities are designed to help achieve the Goal by:
  - Preventing, avoiding, or stopping a threatened or an actual act of terrorism.
  - Protecting our citizens, residents, visitors, and assets against the greatest threats and hazards in a manner that allows our interests, aspirations, and way of life to thrive.
  - Mitigating the loss of life and property by lessening the impact of future disasters.
  - **Responding** quickly to save lives, protect property and the environment, and meet basic human needs in the aftermath of a catastrophic incident.
  - Recovering through a focus on the timely restoration, strengthening, and revitalization of infrastructure, housing, and a sustainable economy, as well as the health, social, cultural, historic, and environmental fabric of communities affected by a catastrophic incident.

# COMING HOMELAND SECURITY EXERCISE AND EVALUATION PROGRAM (HSEEP) REVISIONS

- HSEEP volumes will be consolidated and any required meetings will be driven by the complexity of the exercise.
- HSEEP concepts and terms will align with the National Preparedness Goal, to include the integration of core capabilities.
- Exercise evaluation planning will be emphasized during the initial phases of exercise development.



# MEASURES AND METRICS FOR THE CORE CAPABILITIES

- Using the Core Capability taxonomy and framework, the Bay Area UASI is developing a set of locally tailored performance and preparedness measures and metrics that can be used by Op Area responders to assess their level of ability and state of preparedness.
- Final deliverable is a Compendium of Bay Area Core Capabilities that is then uploaded into the Risk Analysis Center where the assessment data is stored and compared over time.
  - <u>Version 1.0</u>



# MEASURES AND METRICS, CONT.

- This new tool will allow the Op Areas and the region to:
  - Use Op Area assessment data to shape a local picture of preparedness.
  - Roll-up the Op Area data to help shape a regional picture of preparedness.
  - Have a consistent framework to assess capabilities and create a picture of preparedness at the Op Area and regional level over time.
  - Use the picture of preparedness to help inform the Homeland Security Strategy, Threat Hazard Identification and Risk Assessment, and local and regional investments.
  - Use the picture of preparedness and investments to help demonstrate the effectiveness of the UASI program to policy makers.
  - Design HSEEP compliant exercises based on the measures and metrics to evaluate agency and jurisdiction performance.

#### About the Bay Area UASI Training & Exercise Program

In March 2010, the Bay Area Urban Area Security Initiative (BAUASI) initiated a process to identify a qualified Agency to manage the training and exercise function for the San Francisco Bay Area. The BAUSI sought an Agency capable of creating, delivering and managing a new Regional Training and Exercise Program (RTEP), which would be both more efficient and more effective than their existing delivery system. The Alameda County Sheriff's Office was the only Agency to respond to their request.

On July 15, 2011, an MOU was implemented between the BAUSI and the Alameda County Sheriffs Office (ACSO), marking the commencement of the new program. Federal grant funding provided by the Office of Homeland Security through the BAUSI, will support training and exercise for public safety organizations for the twelve (12) Counties identified within the BAUASI tootprint. The program will address the unique planning, organization, equipment, training, and exercise needs of our high-threat, high-density urban area, and will assist in building an enhanced and sustainable capacity to prevent, protect against, respond to, and recover from acts of terrorism. The program is a regional endeavor, which will include participation from multiple disciplines, including but not limited to; law enforcement/tactical, fire/emergency medical services, emergency management and public health.

The Bay Area RTEP goals include improving the regional capacity to prevent, protect against, respond to, and recover from terrorist incidents or other catastrophic events by providing strategic planning, training and exercises. 

#### Title:

Mitigation for Emergency Managers

#### Description:

This course is designed to enable the non-technical emergency worker to acquire skills in the use of mitigation. The course provides training in how to perform mitigation activities fundamental to reducing and eliminating long-term risk from hazards. It addresses the important roles of the emergency program manager (or other local government representative) in mitigation: motivator, coordinator, and monitor in local implementation of the National Mitigation Strategy.

#### Prerequisites:

CST Earthquake is recommended, Basic ICS classes recommended (100, 200 and 700) This course is open to all disciplines however; the emphasis is on Emergency Management.

#### Special Equipment/Other Needs:
