## AOR Wide Infrastructure Development



- Planned, programmed, designed over 1,000 projects, valued over \$2.03 billion at 19 installations
  - Over \$645 in MILCON and O&M,
     Contingency Construction <u>in progress</u>
  - Another \$344.9M pending award
- Development Objectives
  - Support current contingency NOW
    - Agile response to changing mission req'ts
  - Support base's 2010 end state as defined in the CENTCOM Global Base Posture (GBP)
    - Cost effective, sustainable facilities to support CSL or FOS reg'ts







#### **Construction Standards**



- Construction standards should reflect base's IGPBS posture
  - Some bases near end-state, others need work
- Iraqi Bases not included in GBP
  - No long term presence, thus expeditionary standard (stretched fabric structures, K-Spans, modulars, etc)
- Cooperative Security Locations (CSLs)
  - Warm base in caretaker status with semipermanent (cost effective, low maintenance facilities, pre-engr bldgs, modulars, etc)
- Forward Operating Sites (FOSs)
  - Enduring presence with rotational forces, permanent facilities commensurate with HN access agreements (brick and mortar, and preengr bldg construction)













Maintaining expeditionary focus for future facilities... CENTCOM guidance:

- Focus on 4 R's Runways, Ramps,
   RO/RO Berths & RSOI/C2 Facilities
- Construct to expeditionary standard— Modular, pre-engineered metal bldgs, commercial alternatives to WRM
- HN engagement for base access and cost sharing
  - Host Nations who can pay should!
- Both pre-requisite to US-MILCON funding











- Future funding both MILCON and O&M
  - Weaning MILCON from Supplemental to Normal POM'ing process
    - FY06 to be last GWOT Supplemental

OSD to jump start process by taxing service FY 07 programs

- Expect O&M funding to be tighter in FY06 and beyond
- Commanders to prioritize reg'ts, balance risk/cost
- A7 and other functionals to validate req'ts >\$100K





## Accomplishments



- Constructed \$32M Refueler/Strategic/Tactical Ramp at Al Udeid AB, Qatar
  - Provides continuous, 4M square foot ramp--largest in AOR
- Constructed \$48.5M Refueler Ramp at Al Dhafra AB, UAE
  - 1.8M square foot ramp provides parking for 12 refueler aircraft
- Constructed \$31.2M Helicoptor Parking Aprons at Balad AB, Iraq
  - 2-Ramp project parks 138 helos and opens secondary runway
- Constructed \$19.3M Tactical Ramp at Balad AB, Iraq
  - Project provides parking for 21, C-130 aircraft (987K SF)
- Constructed \$26.8M Strategic Ramp at Balad AB, Iraq
  - Project provides parking for 2, C-5 aircraft (442K SF)
- Constructed \$19.8M TCA at Manas AB, Krygyzstan
  - Provides 20 dormitories to relocate 1000 personnel out of tents



## **Accomplishments**



- Completed \$1.6M Ramp repairs at Al Mubarak AB, KCIA, Kuwait
  - Provides KAF-requested repairs caused from APOD mission
- Constructed \$432K AT/FP Wall at Shaikh Isa AB, Bahrain
  - Provides 3.6K foot long concrete wall around US base camp
- Completed \$4.9M Taxiway repairs at Jacobabad AB, Pakistan
  - Repaired damage caused by heavy aircraft-transitioned base back to the Host Nation









  - Contract Award Scheduled for Dec 06
- FY 08 SOF Program Five Projects for \$52.3M
  - Crisis Response Element (CRE), GMV Facility, Storage Facility, Joint Special Ops Air Center, and MC-130/Helo Parking Apron
  - Projects Support AFSOC, USASOC, and NAVSPECWARCOM
  - Customer Concept Documents are in development



### **Future Opportunities**
