














MINUSTAH Force Array








Port-au-Prince 5 Day Outlook




Discussion


Situation Update



JTF-H J2 Assessment: The situation remains calm. Counterfeit tickets were presented at DP6 and the issue was resolved by the NGO on-site. There were no security incidents at the DP or reports of criminals targeting families after they received their rations. The pro-US demonstration is along historic route for demonstrations; assessed to remain non-violent; threatens to offend the GoH and MINUSTAH forces.



(U) Security/Threat Activity



- Gang members in the Warf Jeremie area of Cite Soleil are consolidating, reorganizing and fighting to get control. Gang members have been observed during the night through the early morning hours openly carrying firearms and intimidating the local population.

(U) Infrastructure



- The larger internet service providers have increased their international capabilities and will continue to expand them over the next few weeks.

(U) Medical

- Half of all children brought into hospitals have malaria; increased reports of diarrhea

(U) Governance



- MINUSTAH will provide security for the transfer of \$20 million USD from HSBC to the Central Bank of Haiti.

- Eighteen Haitian senators elected two commissions to monitor aid and manage agreements with aid organizations.

(U) Migration/Internal Relocation




- Haitians living in IDP settlements claim they cannot afford to migrate out of the country.


CIM OVERVIEW



 JIHACC began deployment in support of **Operation Unified Response, Haiti on** 13JAN2010 to support USG Whole of Government relief and reconstruction efforts through JTF Haiti's Joint **Interagency Humanitarian Assistance Coordination Center IOT increase** efficiencies in Foreign Humanitarian Assistance (FHA) and Disaster Response operations and activities.

IDP CAMPS





Current Status:

-Food distribution is equal amongst IDPclusters, however outsiders entering to acquire food is assessed as the attributing factor to individuals not getting any rations.

–UN Clusters are transitioning to focus on sanitation for IDPsover food and water, as it is a growing concern before the oncoming rainy season.

•Information Gaps:

-What can be done in order to halt outsiders coming into camps to gain extra food and water?

-What is needed in order to improve sanitation in IDPcamps? (Trash receptacles, trash pick-up, portable toilets, etc)

•Recommendations:


-Assess IDPclusters in order to get some determination of current sanitation level as reporting is scarce.

Current Status:

- Medical Teams in Leogane report a growing caseload of diarrhea in the last 72 hours, as well as cases of tetanus and suspected measles.
- Various foreign field hospitals are in the process of shutting down. So far, Israel, Russian and Spanish hospitals have ceased operations, and the French will be closing as of 10 FEB.

Information Gaps:

- What other foreign nation hospitals will be closing and when?
- What is the cause for the sudden occurrence of tetanus and measles?

Recommendations:


Acquire an assessment of Leogane in order to help determine what conditions are leading to the ailments not occurring elsewhere.





HA DISTRIBUTION POINTS








FOOD & WATER HUBS





Current Status:

- WFP and its partners have distributed approximately 3.6 million food rations to a total of 458,000 people.

 OCHA is reporting that thousands of stoves are needed to transition from MREs to dry rations of rice and beans.

- Dry rations of rice and beans are now being preferred to over MREs.

 The WASH Cluster reports that water it is reaching 308,000 people through 133 distribution points in Port-au-Prince.

 There is currently no shortage in water, however the UN needs to assess requirements to transport it.

Information Gaps:

– Where are the water distribution points ?

 Where are non-WFP distro points (NGOs, 82nd ABN, MEU etc)

Recommendations:

 Focus will shift from food and water to sanitation. Sanitation issues in IDP clusters will increase with the onset of the rainy season.



HACC UPDATE

United Nations

• MINUSTAH partners including Brazilian, Jordanian, Bolivian and Nepalise military worked ICW JTF-H IOT provide security for delivery of food on WFP Food Distribution H-Day.

•The United Nations Educational, Scientific and Cultural Organization has issued a <u>call to protect</u> Haitian artefacts in the wake of the massive earthquake to prevent pillaging from the rubble of the nation's numerous landmarks, including the Presidential Palace.

Government of Haiti

• The GoH plans to conduct a mass vaccination campaign at temporary settlements. The plan includes inoculating all citizens against diphtheria and tetanus. Inoculation against measles and mumps is planned for children aged 7 and under. Scheduled to begin O/A 2 FEB 10.

•The Haitian Civil Protection Directorate (DPC) estimates that 40,000 Haitians have passed through Saint Marc, with 10,000 seeking permanent residence.

Interagency/NGO

• To date, WFP has provided more than 6.2 million daily rations to more than 639,000 earthquake-affected people in Haiti.

•30 JAN 10 USAID/ DART WASH specialist assessed conditions at the Adventist University, which houseds 12,000 displaced persons during the day and approximately 20,000 during the night.



FRACTURE MEDEVAC





WHO: BN Medic and Immigration Customs Enforcement (ICE)

WHAT: HACC XO, ICE, and BN Medic facilitated and evacuated a 2 year old patient with fractures to his femur and pelvis secondary to a crushing injury as a result of earthquake. Patient and sponser (mother) were treated and evacuated to a medical care facility in the U.S. for definitive treatment.

WHEN: 251400-1700LJAN10

WHERE: USEMB; Port-au-Prince International Airport, Haiti

WHY: Current care facility was incapable of definitive treatment treatment

CIM UPDATE



- Remarks:
 - THE JTF COMMANDERS PRIORITIES ARE 1-WFP AID DISTRIBUTION, 2- MEDICAL FACILITY ASSESSMENT, 3 – SUPPORT TO THE HAITIAN PEOPLE, 4- INTEGRATION WITH MINUSTAH.
 - THE HAITIAN PLANTING SEASON BEGINS IN EARLY/ MID MARCH AND EXTENDS THROUGH THE END OF APRIL. FAILURE TO COORDINATE AND SYNCHRONIZE ACTION PLANS TO EMPOWER HAITIAN FARMERS IN FRONT OF THE PLANTING SEASON COULD RESULT IN EXTENDED REQUIREMENTS FOR EMERGENCY FOOD RELIEF AND ADDITIONAL STRAIN ON CURRENT DONOR MECHANISMS BY AN ESTIMATED 6-9 MONTHS.
