REF G IS THE STATUTORY AUTHORITY UNDER WHICH DOD PROVIDES SUPPORT AT THE REQUEST OF THE FEDERAL EMERGENCY MANAGEMENT AGENCY (FEMA) IN SUPPORT OF STATE AND LOCAL RESPONSE AND RECOVERY EFFORTS WHEN A PRESIDENTIAL MAJOR DISASTER OR EMERGENCY DECLARATION HAS BEEN OR MAY BE ISSUED.

REF H IS THE STATUTORY AUTHORITY UNDER WHICH DOD IS REIMBURSED FOR SUPPORT PROVIDED TO ANOTHER FEDERAL AGENCY UNDER CIRCUMSTANCES WHEN A PRESIDENTIAL DISASTER OR EMERGENCY DECLARATION HAS NOT BEEN ISSUED.

GENTEXT/SITUATION/

1. SITUATION.

1.A. THE PURPOSE OF THIS EXORD IS TO DELEGATE LIMITED APPROVAL AUTHORITY TO SUPPORTED COMBATANT COMMANDERS, WHO HAVE DSCA RESPONSIBILITIES, FOR ROUTINE PA REQUESTS FOR ASSISTANCE (RFA), INCLUDING THE TYPES OF RFA HISTORICALLY SUBMITTED BY PA, TO PROVIDE A RAPID AND FLEXIBLE DOD RESPONSE TO FEDERAL PRIMARY AGENCIES FOR POTENTIAL OR ACTUAL EMERGENCIES AND OR DISASTERS WITHIN THE UNITED STATES, ITS TERRITORIES, POSSESSIONS, AND PROTECTORATES.

1.B. REF C PROVIDES THE GUIDING PRINCIPLES THAT ENABLE ALL RESPONSE PARTNERS TO PREPARE FOR AND PROVIDE A UNIFIED NATIONAL RESPONSE TO DISASTERS AND EMERGENCIES AND FOR THE MANAGEMENT OF DOMESTIC INCIDENTS, INCLUDING THE COORDINATION OF FEDERAL SUPPORT TO STATE, LOCAL, AND TRIBAL AUTHORITIES, AS WELL AS PROVIDING USG INTERAGENCY SUPPORT OF FEDERAL AGENCIES EXERCISING DIRECT FEDERAL AUTHORITIES AND RESPONSIBILITIES.

1.C. DEPARTMENT OF HOMELAND SECURITY (DHS) IS THE PA FOR DOMESTIC INCIDENT MANAGEMENT OPERATIONS WITHIN CONUS, ALASKA, HAWAII, AND THE U.S. INSULAR AREAS WITH THE EXCEPTION OF PALAU, THE FEDERATED STATES OF MICRONESIA, AND THE REPUBLIC OF THE MARSHALL ISLANDS. THE INSULAR AREAS ARE DEFINED AS U.S. TERRITORIES (AMERICAN SAMOA, GUAM, PUERTO RICO, U.S. VIRGIN ISLANDS), POSSESSIONS, AND PROTECTORATES, THE FEDERATED STATES OF MICRONESIA, THE REPUBLIC OF THE MARSHALL ISLANDS AND THE COMMONWEALTH OF THE NORTHERN MARIANA ISLANDS.

1.C.1. UNITED STATES AGENCY FOR INTERNATIONAL DEVELOPMENT (USAID) IS THE PA FOR THE INSULAR AREAS OF PALAU, THE FEDERATED STATES OF MICRONESIA, AND THE REPUBLIC OF THE MARSHALL ISLANDS.

1.D. NIFC IS THE INTERAGENCY BODY RESPONSIBLE FOR COORDINATING THE FEDERAL RESPONSE ISO WFF OPERATIONS WITHIN THE DOMESTIC MANAGEMENT AREA OF OPERATIONS.

1.E. DEPARTMENT OF COMMERCE/NOAA IS THE PA RESPONSIBLE FOR WEATHER RECON OPERATIONS, ICW THE DEPARTMENT OF DEFENSE.

1.F. DHS/FEMA IS THE PA RESPONSIBLE FOR COORDINATING AND PROVIDING FEDERAL ASSISTANCE TO STATE AND LOCAL AUTHORITIES IN RESPONSE TO THE CONSEQUENCES OF NATURAL OR MAN-MADE DISASTERS OR EMERGENCIES, CATASTROPHIC EVENTS, AND TERRORIST ATTACKS.

1.G. THE CIVIL AIR PATROL IS A FEDERALLY CHARTERED NON-PROFIT CORPORATION THAT MAY BE UTILIZED AS A CIVILIAN VOLUNTEER AUXILIARY OF THE AIR FORCE. THE SECRETARY OF THE AIR FORCE HAS DELEGATED APPROVAL AUTHORITY TO THE FIRST, ELEVENTH, AND THIRTEENTH AIR FORCE COMMANDERS FOR U.S. AIR FORCE AUXILIARY (AF AUX) AIR FORCE-ASSIGNED MISSIONS FOR CIVIL SUPPORT SUCH AS SITUATIONAL AWARENESS, DAMAGE ASSESSMENT, EVACUATION MONITORING AND LIGHT AIRLIFT. AF AUX IS CAPABLE OF CONDUCTING IMAGERY AND ASSESSMENT (VISUAL OBSERVATION, STILL

PHOTOGRAPHY, AND HYPER SPECTRAL IMAGING) OF THE AFFECTED AREA. EMPLOYMENT OF AF AUX FORCES DOES NOT REQUIRE SECDEF APPROVAL OR CJCS AND SECDEF NOTIFICATION. THE NUMBERED AIR FORCE COMMANDER RETAINS OPCON OF AF AUX FORCES.

1.H. CDRUSTRANSCOM IS THE AUTHORITY TO CONCUR OR NONCONCUR WITH THE MARITIME ADMINISTRATION REQUESTS TO TEMPORARILY USE VESSELS OF THE READY RESERVE FORCE (RRF) FOR STORAGE OF NON-DEFENSE RELATED CARGO PER REF HH.

1.I. DOD PROVIDES DSCA AS DIRECTED BY THE PRESIDENT OR SECDEF IN RESPONSE TO A PA RFA. SECDEF OR A DELEGATED AUTHORITY MAY APPROVE DSCA REQUESTS IN RESPONSE TO ACTUAL OR POTENTIAL DOMESTIC INCIDENTS, INCLUDING TERRORIST ATTACKS, MAJOR DISASTERS, CATASTROPHIC INCIDENTS, AND OTHER EMERGENCIES. THIS EXORD IS NOT INTENDED FOR CBRNE INCIDENTS. SUCH RESPONSES ARE GOVERNED BY THE CBRNE CM EXORD (REF Z), BUT BOTH EXORDS CAN BE USED IN CONJUNCTION WITH ONE ANOTHER. THE SUPPORTED COMBATANT COMMANDER MUST NOTIFY THE SECRETARY OF DEFENSE (SECDEF) AND THE CHAIRMAN OF THE JOINT CHIEFS OF STAFF (CJCS) UNDER WHICH AUTHORITY THE SUPPORT IS BEING PROVIDED; I.E., THIS EXORD OR THE CBRNE CM EXORD (REF Z).

1.J. RECEIPT, VALIDATION AND APPROVAL OF A PA RFA IS REQUIRED PRIOR TO EMPLOYMENT OF DOD TITLE 10 FORCES OR ASSETS COVERED IN THIS ORDER WITH THE EXCEPTION OF THOSE LISTED IN CATEGORY 3 BELOW. THE REQUEST FOR FORCES (RFF) PROCESS WITH A COST ESTIMATE FOR FORCES REQUESTED IN SUPPORT OF DSCA OPERATIONS MAY BE USED AS AN EXCEPTION TO THIS PROCESS.

1.K. DEPLOYMENT OF RESOURCES TO CONDUCT DSCA MUST NOT INTERFERE WITH THE PRIMARY DOD MISSION UNLESS OTHERWISE DIRECTED BY THE PRESIDENT OR SECDEF./

2. MISSION. DOD PROVIDES DSCA SUPPORT, WHEN REQUESTED BY A PRIMARY AGENCY AND APPROVED BY THE SECRETARY OF DEFENSE OR AS DIRECTED BY THE PRESIDENT, IN RESPONSE TO ACTUAL OR POTENTIAL NATURAL OR MAN-MADE DISASTERS OR CATASTROPHIC INCIDENTS OR OTHER EMERGENCIES./

3. CONCEPT OF OPERATIONS.

3.A. THIS EXORD ESTABLISHES AUTHORITIES PROVIDED TO THE SUPPORTED COMBATANT COMMANDER (CCDR) TO CONDUCT DSCA OPERATIONS FOR ACTUAL OR POTENTIAL DOMESTIC INCIDENTS WITHIN THE CCDRS AOR. THE AUTHORITIES GRANTED BY THIS EXORD ARE SPECIFIED IN FOUR DISTINCT CATEGORIES. NOTIFICATION AS OUTLINED IN PARA 11.C. TO SECDEF THROUGH CJCS IS REQUIRED BEFORE MOVEMENT OR ASSUMPTION OF PREPARE TO DEPLOY ORDER (PTDO) STATUS.

3.A.1. CATEGORY 1. ASSIGNED AND ALLOCATED FORCES. SUPPORTED CCDRS ARE AUTHORIZED TO PERFORM THE FOLLOWING ACTIONS WITH ASSIGNED AND ALLOCATED FORCES:

3.A.1.A. PLACE FORCES ON PTDO STATUS.

3.A.1.B. DEPLOY FORCES (CJCS AND SECDEF NOTIFICATIONS REQUIRED FIRST).

3.A.1.C. EMPLOY FORCES UPON RECEIPT OF A SUPPORTED CCDCR VALIDATED AND APPROVED PA RFA (CJCS AND SECDEF NOTIFICATIONS REQUIRED FIRST).

3.A.2. CATEGORY 2. PRE-IDENTIFIED RESOURCES. SUPPORTED CCDRS ARE AUTHORIZED TO PERFORM THE FOLLOWING ACTIONS WITH RESOURCES LISTED IN PARA 4.B.:

3.A.2.A. COORDINATE DIRECTLY WITH FORCE PROVIDERS TO SOURCE PRE-IDENTIFIED RESOURCES IN PARA 4.B. AND PLACE THOSE FORCES ON 24-HOUR PTDO STATUS (CJCS AND SECDEF NOTIFICATIONS REQUIRED FIRST).

3.A.2.A.1. FORCES MAY BE REQUIRED TO MAINTAIN PTDO STATUS FOR UP TO SEVEN (7) CONSECUTIVE DAYS, UNLESS OTHERWISE APPROVED BY SECDEF.

3.A.2.A.2. REQUEST FORCE PROVIDERS TO DEPLOY FORCES TO THE SUPPORTED CCDCR'S AOR (CJCS AND SECDEF NOTIFICATIONS REQUIRED FIRST).

3.A.2.C. EMPLOY FORCES UPON RECEIPT OF A SUPPORTED CCDR VALIDATED AND APPROVED PA RFA (CJCS AND SECDEF NOTIFICATIONS REQUIRED FIRST).

3.A.3. CATEGORY 3. RESOURCES FOR INTERNAL USE. SUPPORTED CCDRS ARE AUTHORIZED TO PERFORM THE FOLLOWING ACTIONS WITH RESOURCES LISTED IN PARA 4.C.:

3.A.3.A. COORDINATE DIRECTLY WITH FORCE PROVIDERS TO SOURCE RESOURCES IN PARA 4.C. AND PLACE FORCES ON 24-HOUR PTDO STATUS (CJCS AND SECDEF NOTIFICATIONS REQUIRED FIRST).

3.A.3.A.1. FORCES MAY BE REQUIRED TO MAINTAIN PTDO STATUS FOR UP TO SEVEN (7) CONSECUTIVE DAYS, UNLESS OTHERWISE APPROVED BY SECDEF.

3.A.3.B. REQUEST FORCE PROVIDERS TO DEPLOY SOURCED FORCES TO THE SUPPORTED CCDR'S AOR (CJCS AND SECDEF NOTIFICATIONS REQUIRED FIRST).

3.A.3.C. EMPLOY FORCES (CJCS AND SECDEF NOTIFICATIONS REQUIRED FIRST).

3.A.3.D. FORCES MAY BE DEPLOYED AND EMPLOYED WITH OR WITHOUT A PA RFA. ALL OPERATIONAL FORCES DEPLOYED AND EMPLOYED WITHOUT AN APPROVED RFA ARE AT THE EXPENSE OF DOD; A PA RFA FOR THESE DOD FORCES SHOULD BE REQUESTED FROM THE PA.

3.A.3.E. FORCES EMPLOYED WITHOUT AN RFA ARE LIMITED TO SUPPORTING DOD INTERNAL REQUIREMENTS.

3.A.4. CATEGORY 4. LARGE-SCALE RESPONSE RESOURCES.

3.A.4.A. FORCES IDENTIFIED IN PARA 4.D. CONSTITUTE LARGE-SCALE RESPONSE RESOURCES. THESE RESOURCES ARE INTENDED FOR LARGE-SCALE INCIDENTS, SUCH AS PREDICTED LANDFALL OF A MAJOR HURRICANE OR AN INCIDENT THAT OCCURS WITHOUT WARNING, AND THE RESPONSE TO WHICH IS ANTICIPATED BY THE SUPPORTED CCDR, IN CLOSE COORDINATION WITH THE PA AND NGB, TO EXCEED THE CAPABILITIES OF THE LOCAL AND STATE(S) AUTHORITIES (INCLUDING NATIONAL GUARD AND EMERGENCY MANAGEMENT ASSISTANCE COMPACT (EMAC) RESOURCES).

3.A.4.B. SUPPORTED CCDRS WILL INITIATE THE PTDO PROCESS BY SUBMITTING AN RFF VIA THE STANDARD RFF PROCESS AND WILL INCLUDE A COST ESTIMATE.

3.A.4.B.1. A PA RFA IS NOT REQUIRED FOR SUPPORTED CCDRS TO SUBMIT AN RFF.

3.A.4.C. SECDEF APPROVAL IS REQUIRED TO INITIATE PLACING FORCES ON PTDO, AND FOR DEPLOYMENT OR EMPLOYMENT. A SEPARATE SECDEF-APPROVED EXORD THAT RESPONDS TO APPROVING THE SUPPORTED CCDR'S RFF WILL PROVIDE CLARIFYING DELEGATED AUTHORITY TO THE SUPPORTED CCDR.

3.A.5. MARITIME COMMAND ELEMENT: UPON THE SUPPORTED CCDR'S REQUEST, SUPPORTING CCDRS, MAY TRANSFER A COMMAND ELEMENT TACON TO THE SUPPORTED CCDR, WHILE MAINTAINING CONCURRENT COCOM/OPCON AUTHORITY UNDER THE PARENT CCDR. EXAMPLES OF A COMMAND ELEMENT INCLUDE, BUT ARE NOT LIMITED TO, A FLEET COMMANDER, A CARRIER STRIKE GROUP COMMANDER, AND AN EXPEDITIONARY STRIKE GROUP COMMANDER. THE ROLE OF THE COMMAND ELEMENT IS TO EXERCISE COMMAND AND CONTROL OF FORCES TACON TO THE SUPPORTED CCDR.

4.A.1. ALL ASSIGNED AND ALLOCATED FORCES.

4.B. CATEGORY 2: PRE-IDENTIFIED RESOURCES.

4.B.1. DOD INSTALLATIONS:
