

We are informed that at least 90 out of the 250,000 documents anticipated to be posted on Wikileaks by Friday afternoon or soon thereafter relate to Canada. Many more documents may also pertain to Canada. DFAIT is the lead interdepartmentally on this file. Following appropriate consultations and for security reasons, access to the Wikileaks site from DFAIT computers has been blocked on all signet computers. Consequently, it was agreed at the second meeting of the taskforce today that:

A "war room" will be set up by noon, November 26th and will remain in operation for the weekend and beyond, as needed (see hours of operations below). Thank you to AITC and CEC for their assistance. The war room will be located on A2-217.

The war room will be charged with:

- The safe downloading of wikileaks documents on stand alone computers
- The identification and initial assessment of documents of interest to DFAIT and OGDs
- The preparation of Situation Reports, primarily for the use of senior management and ministers, as appropriate (a template will be developed overnight, contact point is Shawn Barber (DCL)

The war room will be staffed as follows:

- A rotating team leader (to be confirmed tomorrow morning) who will oversee the operations
- A rotating group of team experts (to be circulated tomorrow morning) who will be responsible for the initial review of pre-identified, and "of interest to" Canada documents
- · A group of search experts who will narrow the list of documents of interests based on pre-identified search words
- Supporting and technical staff
- A Communication bureau liaison officer

All communications on this matter will be channelled to BCD, BCM for onward review and action with ministers' offices and if required, interdepartmentally

For the time being, the Corporate Secretariat will be responsible to lead the taskforce, constituted of all those in the addressee line to this e-mail.

To support this effort, we are asking: :

- 1. With respect to the US branch more specifically, GGD and GWX i) to remain on alert starting at 5pm, Friday November 26; ii) to assign a rotating team expert to be in the war room from Friday noon to Sunday night at 10:00pm to provide initial review of Canada-US relations documents; and as appropriate, iii) to liaise with other government departments on issues from a policy perspective.
- 2. Each geographic DG to i) make himself or herself available to be reached by phone over the weekend through the Ops centre, starting at 5pm on Friday; ii) be ready to sign off on assessments pertinent to their sectors for onward transmission to deputies and/or ministers; iii) pre-designate a number of experts in their branch to be made available as needed. DCL will be in contact with your offices to follow up on this request.

- 4. BSD and BSI to be prepared to engage provincial and territorial governments, as needed, on files of interest.

Report: First meeting of "Taskforce" on Wikileaks and next steps.

A brief meeting was held earlier today to assess DFAIT implications and next steps on the anticipated, non-authorized release of approximately 285,000 documents from State Department databanks (see AP story below for reference). Release is expected Friday, November 26 and relates to a range of unclassified and secret documents, covering roughly 5 years, over an unknown but vast array of issues. Addressees to this e-mail are now part of a rapidly assembled taskforce. Geographic DGs are welcome to attend all meetings.

Participants noted at the meeting the potentially many implications for Canada: bilateral and multilateral relations, national security, privacy, consular.

It was subsequently confirmed by PCO Comms that DFAIT is the lead, at least until the documents are published and assessment is made of their content.

The taskforce agreed that:

On a responsive basis:

- BCM will act as the assembling and distributing division for relevant media coverage of wikileaks
- The policy lead for media lines and overall integration of analysis will be GND/GGD

On a proactive basis:

- AIEM and AITC will provide taskforce with recommendations on how best to "process", "store" the wikileaks to
- support an easy, and non-duplicative review by relevant sectors by COB November 24th.
 All represented branches/bureaux at the taskforce meeting will be responsible for reviewing those sections of the wikileaks relevant to their areas of responsibilities
- DCD will task the production of an initial assessment by relevant sectors, for sign off by DGs, compilation and
 integration by a team/lead sector (likely GND and GGD), and onward transmission to deputies offices
- BCM and GLB will assess the need to equip HOMs with media lines as needed.
- CSD/CSS will assess need to provide directives to DFAIT employees regarding reviewing the wikileaks site.

A meeting will be held on November 25 to review state of play.

WASHINGTON (AP) _ The Obama administration said Wednesday it has warned Congress that the WikiLeaks website is preparing to release sensitive U.S. diplomatic records that could damage U.S. relations across the globe.

"These revelations are harmful to the United States and our interests," State Department spokesman P.J. Crowley said. "They are going to create tension in relationships between our diplomats and our friends around the world."

In anticipation of the posting of the leaked documents by the self-styled whistle-blower website, U.S. diplomatic outposts around the world have begun notifying other governments that it may happen within days, Crowley told reporters.

"We wish this would not happen, but we are obviously prepared for the possibility that it will," he said.

A Pentagon spokesman, Marine Col. David Lapan, said the Pentagon also has notified congressional committees of an expected WikiLeaks release. He said the files are believed to be State Department documents, but they could contain information about military tactics or reveal the identities of sources.

Crowley said the State Department "has known all along" that WikiLeaks has obtained classified State Department documents.

Media Summary:

Of the news organizations with advance copies, only the Guardian editor acknowledged that the paper has reviewed the material. The UK has also issued a Defence Advisory to the press and requested that news organizations brief the government if they plan to publish sensitive diplomatic files.

Anticipation of the release of the newest documents is being widely discussed and analysed. From a Canadian context, commentators referred to the damage caused during Naftagate as a possible reference point for damage control but also noted that previously-leaked information from Wikileaks generally had little consequence for Canada.

Generally, commentators agree it is valid to be concerned for the safety of foreigners and people at risk who are named in cables.

Speculation about what's in the documents ranges from allegations of corruption against foreign governments and reports on politicians in Russia and Afghanistan, to notes exposing behind-the-scenes Canada-U.S. diplomacy over Omar Khadr.

CBC reader survey: "Should WikiLeaks publish sensitive U.S. diplomatic files?", 85% in favour, 11% against out of 57,000 votes. Comments online range from calling the wikileaks a form of terrorism to others encouraging as much exposure as possible.

Twittersphere following closely with many urging a quick release of information before a war breaks out between North and South Korea and steals the headlines.

Next Steps

A message providing additional guidance, communication and additional tasking is being prepared for consideration by USS and DMA for onward transmission to Heads of Mission this weekend.







A brief meeting was held earlier today to assess DFAIT implications and next steps on the anticipated, non-authorized release of approximately 285,000 documents from State Department databanks (see AP story below for reference). Release is expected Friday, November 26 and relates to a range of unclassified and secret documents, covering roughly 5 years, over an unknown but vast array of issues. Addressees to this e-mail are now part of a rapidly assembled taskforce. Geographic DGs are welcome to attend all meetings.

Participants noted at the meeting the potentially many implications for Canada: bilateral and multilateral relations, national security, privacy, consular.

It was subsequently confirmed by PCO Comms that DFAIT is the lead, at least until the documents are published and assessment is made of their content.

The taskforce agreed that:

On a responsive basis:

- BCM will act as the assembling and distributing division for relevant media coverage of wikileaks
- The policy lead for media lines and overall integration of analysis will be GND/GGD

On a proactive basis:

- AIEM and AITC will provide taskforce with recommendations on how best to "process", "store" the wikileaks to support an easy, and non-duplicative review by relevant sectors by COB November 24th.
- All represented branches/bureaux at the taskforce meeting will be responsible for reviewing those sections of the wikileaks relevant to their areas of responsibilities
- DCD will task the production of an initial assessment by relevant sectors, for sign off by DGs, compilation and integration by a team/lead sector (likely GND and GGD), and onward transmission to deputies offices
- BCM and GLB will assess the need to equip HOMs with media lines as needed
- CSD/CSS will assess need to provide directives to DFAIT employees regarding reviewing the wikileaks site.

A meeting will be held on November 25 to review state of play.

WASHINGTON (AP) _ The Obama administration said Wednesday it has warned Congress that the WikiLeaks website is preparing to release sensitive U.S. diplomatic records that could damage U.S. relations across the globe.

"These revelations are harmful to the United States and our interests," State Department spokesman P.J. Crowley said. "They are going to create tension in relationships between our diplomats and our friends around

the world."

In anticipation of the posting of the leaked documents by the self-styled whistle-blower website, U.S. diplomatic outposts around the world have begun notifying other governments that it may happen within days, Crowley told reporters.

"We wish this would not happen, but we are obviously prepared for the possibility that it will," he said.

A Pentagon spokesman, Marine Col. David Lapan, said the Pentagon also has notified congressional committees of an expected WikiLeaks release. He said the files are believed to be State Department documents, but they could contain information about military tactics or reveal the identities of sources.

Crowley said the State Department "has known all along" that WikiLeaks has obtained classified State Department documents.



Subject: Report: First meeting of "Taskforce" on Wikileaks and next steps.

A brief meeting was held earlier today to assess DFAIT implications and next steps on the anticipated, non-authorized release of approximately 285,000 documents from State Department databanks (see AP story below for reference). Release is expected Friday, November 26 and relates to a range of unclassified and secret documents, covering roughly 5 years, over an unknown but vast array of issues. Addressees to this e-mail are now part of a rapidly assembled taskforce. Geographic DGs are welcome to attend all meetings.

Participants noted at the meeting the potentially many implications for Canada: bilateral and multilateral relations, national security, privacy, consular.

It was subsequently confirmed by PCO Comms that DFAIT is the lead, at least until the documents are published and assessment is made of their content.

The taskforce agreed that:

On a responsive basis:

- BCM will act as the assembling and distributing division for relevant media coverage of wikileaks
- The policy lead for media lines and overall integration of analysis will be GND/GGD

On a proactive basis:

- AIEM and AITC will provide taskforce with recommendations on how best to "process", "store" the
 wikileaks to support an easy, and non-duplicative review by relevant sectors by COB November 24th.
- All represented branches/bureaux at the taskforce meeting will be responsible for reviewing those sections of the wikileaks relevant to their areas of responsibilities
- DCD will task the production of an initial assessment by relevant sectors, for sign off by DGs, compilation
 and integration by a team/lead sector (likely GND and GGD), and onward transmission to deputies' offices
- BCM and GLB will assess the need to equip HOMs with media lines as needed
- CSD/CSS will assess need to provide directives to DFAIT employees regarding reviewing the wikileaks site.

A meeting will be held on November 25 to review state of play.

WASHINGTON (AP) _ The Obama administration said Wednesday it has warned Congress that the WikiLeaks website is preparing to release sensitive U.S. diplomatic records that could damage U.S. relations across the globe.

"These revelations are harmful to the United States and our interests," State Department spokesman P.J. Crowley said. "They are going to create tension in relationships between our diplomats and our friends around the world."

In anticipation of the posting of the leaked documents by the self-styled whistle-blower website, U.S. diplomatic outposts around the world have begun notifying other governments that it may happen within days, Crowley told reporters.

"We wish this would not happen, but we are obviously prepared for the possibility that it will," he said. A Pentagon spokesman, Marine Col. David Lapan, said the Pentagon also has notified congressional committees of an expected WikiLeaks release. He said the files are believed to be State Department documents, but they could contain information about military tactics or reveal the identities of sources.

Crowley said the State Department "has known all along" that WikiLeaks has obtained classified State Department documents.

I'm writing to you on behalf of the Wikileaks Task Force (Chair Roxanne Dubé and core members copied here).

You will be aware that the website Wikileaks will be making public a large amount of information from State Department databases as early as tomorrow. This information will include an extensive cache of State Department diplomatic reporting. We do not have an indication of the extent of information on Canada at this time. We can anticipate, however, that employees of this Department (and possibly others) could be named, referenced or quoted in some instances. This is, of course, standard in diplomatic reporting, but will assume a new dimension if individuals are identified and their comments are reported on.

This message is intended as a heads up to you for your early consideration of approaches, personnel support, legal considerations, privacy and media advice, should employees be specifically identiified in documents that are

released. As DFAIT is taking the lead on wikileaks on behalf of all of government, we would appreciate your considerations, and would see them as the basis on which to advise OGDs, should their employees be named.

Again, we have no idea of the magnitude of this potential issue, and it could be minimal. Nonetheless, we wanted to bring it to your attention for your awareness and consideration to allow for an approach to be in place, should this become a live issue when the documents enter the public domain. We would also be grateful if you could identify a lead point of coordination.

Our Information Management colleagues have now been able to access the Wikileaks website. This is what we currently know:

- Wikileaks has posted 219 documents on their site. These have to be downloaded individually as they are HTML documents (this is a departure from previous Wikileak practice). We are currently downloading these documents and when completed will begin analyzing them for Canadian content.
- None of this first tranche of documents has Canada in the subject line or appears to originate from the US Embassy in Ottawa or other US diplomatic missions in Canada.
- There are 2,648 documents out of a total of 251,287 where Canada is the subject of the message.
- The reports range from 1966 to Feb 2010.
- The Wikileaks site contains the following notice "The embassy cables will be released in stages over the next few months."
- Wikileaks reports that the total information download will be 7 times larger than the 'Iraq Diaries'.

Carole: All right, breaking news on our top story this hour. "The New York times" has released new leaked documents from wikileaks. The documents refer to Canada and Canadian diplomats. Rosemary barton has the story. Rosemary?

Rosemary: Carole, this is a document pertaining to guantanamo detainees, and we were expecting that Canada might be mentioned in this exchange of diplomatic cables. It dates back to July of 2008, and it's a conversation, an exchange between a counsellor at the state department and the former head of c.S.I.S., Jim judd. As you can well imagine, most of the exchange deals with omar khadr. They talk about that infamous video, you'll remember now, that was released by the supreme court of Canada showing omar khadr being interrogated by c.S.I.S. Officers, and they're trying to gauge really Canada's reaction to that dvd. Judd tell us the state department official that he believes there will be heightened pressure on the Canadian government for the return of omar khadr once Canadians have seen the video. He talks about "an alice in wonderland" world view of Canadians and their courts that is tying c.S.I.S. In knots. He derides the Canadian courts for undermining foreign intelligence gathering at c.S.I.S. And he talks very positively about Stephen Harper and the conservative government's ability to "take it on the chin" when it comes to how the courts are trying to put pressure on Harper and the opposition parties are trying to put pressure on Harper to have omar khadr repatriated. He talks about how sections of that dvd that Canadians may well be familiar with now would trigger a knee-jerk anti-americanism and would result in paroxysms of moral outrage, a Canadian specialty. A very frank assessment from the former head of c.S.I.S. Who subsequently resigned in 2009 in reaction to omar khadr, this video being released, and how it should be interpreted by the US State department.

Carole: As we say, we're expecting a couple of thousand anyway documents pertaining to Canada and our relationship with the United States which mentioned a number of things. We're getting the headlines now. That's one of them. Rosemary, thank you very much.

Rosemary: You're welcome.

Carole: We are expecting the others sometime this week. That's the CBC's rosemary barton in Ottawa.

Summary of new reports from Canadian Missions:

U.S. media was not at all focussed on the Canadian angle, as they have focussed on some of the colourful language used to describe some world leaders as well as focussing on the more problematic relationships in Afghanistan, Pakistan, Turkey, Arab states and Russia. The only Canadian coverage was references in some articles (including in the Washington Post) that Canada was one of the countries that Secretary Clinton had contacted and some references to Ambassador Jacobson's call to Minister Cannon with speculation that the conversation might have included discussion regarding Omar Khadr. There have been no references to Canadian political leadership or Canada-U.S. issues. Although the Canadian press has reported on the Canadian angle in two of the Afghan reports, there has been no reference here.

Communications

During the afternoon, the Canadian media continued to focus on statements by both Minister Cannon and U.S. Secretary of State Hillary Clinton regarding the effect of the leaked documents on U.S. relations with other countries.

In the early evening, several media sources discuss documents revealed by the New York Times pertaining to the case of Omar Khadr. The pieces focus on comments by former CSIS director Jim Judd, who reportedly described Canadians as having an "Alice in Wonderland" worldview. Judd commented on the videotaped interrogations by Canadian agents of Omar Khadr, saying it could trigger "knee-jerk anti-Americanism" and "paroxysms of moral outrage." The former spy chief reportedly claimed the video would add pressure on Ottawa to seek Khadr's repatriation. The Globe and Mail also discussed other CSIS actions around the world, and cited Judd's reported comments about CSIS operations against Hezbollah supporters in Canada.

Twitter comments on the issue mainly posted links to articles discussing the leaked documents. Of note, several tweets linked to a GeoNewBlog post explaining several world governments http://www.geonewsblog.com/2010/11/30/aus-canada-iraq-condemn-wikileaks/? utm_source=geonewblog.com&utm_medium=twitter>, including Canada, condemned the leaked documents.

A report on Connect with Mark Kelley stated the US is downplaying the impact of the cables on diplomatic relations. US officials are taking a different stance this evening with Hillary Clinton saying foreign political leaders understand that "without the ability to speak frankly, diplomacy can't work."

Berlin

He simply stated that the German and US government were united in their regret over the publication of confidential documents. Communications

Significant coverage in national print dailies highlighted Minister Cannon's condemnation of WikiLeaks' release of sensitive U.S. State Department cables. According to the dailies, Canada is mentioned in over 2,000 diplomatic cables leaked from the U.S. embassy and various consulates in Canada. Several articles report the documents indicate Afghan President Hamid Karzai's brother, Ahmed Wali Karzai, lobbied Canada "aggressively" to obtain a contract to provide private security for aid projects to rebuild the Dhala Dam in southern Afghanistan. The dailies note the documents show American and Canadian diplomats met with Karzai and felt wary of what U.S. diplomats viewed as his "malign" influence. According to the articles, documents further implicating Canada, including documents on Omar Khadr, would be potentially released this week. La couverture médiatique des quotidiens francophones et anglophones se concentrent sur les mêmes éléments.

Throughout the day, websites and broadcast media focussed on Canada's reaction to the leaked documents. The pieces explain the Canadian government downplayed the importance of the documents, nothing that according to Minister Cannon, the leaks would not harm relations between Canada and the U.S.

Articles on Minister Cannon's statements were widely distributed through *Twitter*. *CBC News* published a link explaining how to search Wikileaks for specific cables along with a list of the most commonly used tags in Canadian cables. Several broadcast news stations carried live Minister Cannon's statements on the leaks, followed closely by those of U.S. Secretary of State Hillary Clinton. The *National Post*'s Lorne Gunter published a piece stating the Wikileaks documents are "underwhelming."

One step could be to send a C5 to HoMs re: drawing attention to safety of Canadian personnel and safety of Canadians in their host country. Guidance could be to relay any country-specific concern to lead division responsible (eg. security, consular).

We would need to ensure this does not sound alarming, but rather seen as an issue of due diligence, also recognizing that risk doesn't apply to all countries.

As requested, the following is DELHI's initial summary report on Indian reactions to the WikiLeaks. This report is based primarily on local media coverage. DELHI will provide ongoing reporting as developments warrant.

Media coverage of Wikileaks "cablegate" today in Indian media reflected the fact that the Indian Ministry of External Affairs (MEA) and the Indian press have not fully processed the information in yesterday's first release. According to the Indo-Asian News Services, 3,038 of the cables planned for release are from the US embassy in India (only part of the cache was release yesterday, with more to follow). At least 22 documents of the 226 US cables released yesterday have an Indian connection. Topics covered include India-Pakistan relations; India-Afghanistan; India-US; Iran; Nuclear; and, India's bilateral relations with other countries.

Indian analysts are also following cables related to Pakistan, particularly when they impact India. The Times of India reports "Pakistan, the world's nightmare," referencing cables that show US officials to be sceptical of Pakistani leadership. Another story notes that "Turkey did not invite India for a regional meeting on Afghanistan to appease Pakistan". On this latter issue, the full cable may be seen to cast the US in a positive light vis-a-vis India as one commentator concludes that "While Pakistan's reservations to India's presence at the meeting was known, the US assessment that excluding India from regional structures would be a mistake is a disclosure that will be well-received in New Delhi." US cables that discuss Pakistan's nuclear assets are also of great interest to Indian analysts and commentators.

Here are the Indian MEA's public reactions as of Nov 29:

Minister of State for External Affairs Preneet Kaur on Monday:" This is a very sensitive issue. We have good bilateral relations with the US and they had already warned us.... So, I think it is not the right time to comment on it and we want to continue having good relationship with the US. So, let us wait and work this out,"

Here's a summary of reporting and commentary about this issue in the Turkish language press.

WikiLeaks Documents Come To Daylight

The whistle-blower site WikiLeaks yesterday began publishing more than 250000 cables from US embassies worldwide. Today's papers give extensive front-page coverage to the scandal. Akşam daily newspaper notes that the leak was "the "9/11 of world diplomacy."

The US Embassy in Ankara produced the most cables, Hürriyet daily newspaper notes. The paper says that there were controversial expressions in the cables sent to Washington from Ankara:

US diplomats say that Turkey hardly could be trusted because it was not likely to join the EU and was heading to Islamist future.

The documents show that the US Embassy in Ankara views Turkey as a country with divisions in leadership.

The cables say Turkish Prime Minister Recep Tayyip Erdoğan had incompetent advisors and was pursuing a secret agenda.

Erdoğan is described as "stubborn, workaholic and perfectionist." The cables say that he was not a tyrant.

The documents show that Turkey was not trusted by the US, Hürriyet notes.

The cables show that Turkish Foreign Minister Ahmet Davutoğlu was viewed by US diplomats as "exceptionally dangerous" figure and were alarmed by his aspirations to reassert the influence the Ottoman Empire used to exert on the region.

It is clear that the US prepared detailed reports about Prime Minister Erdoğan and AK Party, Vatan daily newspaper notes. The paper adds that Ergenekon was closely watched by the US and that US officials were holding talks with Turkish generals. Both the Turkish government and the Turkish army were under close US surveillance, the paper notes.

Taraf daily newspaper in turn notes that according to the cables, the business connections of Prime Minister Erdoğan's son-in-law were closely watched by the US. (Hürriyet 29.11,1,20, Vatan 29.11,1,14,15, Sabah 29.11,16, Akşam 29.11,1,16, Taraf 29.11,1-3)

Cables Likely To Trigger Crisis Between Turkey and the US
Milliyet columnist Aslı Aydıntaşbaş says that the assessments about Prime Minister Recep Tayyip
Erdoğan and Foreign Minister Ahmet Davutoğlu in secret documents made public by WikiLeaks were
expected to cause the biggest trouble in Turkish ties with the US.

The documents show that the Americans don't view the government in Ankara as a real ally and have concerns about the reliability of Turkish politicians. The writer says that the secret cables were expected to rock Turkish politics. The cables will boost mistrust between Turkey and the US, the writer notes.

She notes that the documents were released at a time when Turkish Foreign Minister Ahmet Davutoğlu was visiting Washington. Nevertheless, the documents are not the only issue in Turco-American relations. The failure to send a new US ambassador to Turkey also will come to the agenda.

US Ambassador James Jeffrey left Turkey in the summer. Since then, the US has not been able to appoint a new ambassador because the Republicans in the US Congress object to the diplomat nominated by Obama administration – Francis Ricciardone. The Republicans are punishing Ricciardone because he is showing too much willingness to compromise, and at the same time they send a message to AK Party because of its tensions with Israel and close ties with Iran.

The writer says that there were three alternatives for US President Obama: He might use his power to make a recess appointment and sent Francis Ricciardone to Turkey despite the objections of the Republicans. He might bargain with the Republicans to secure support for Ricciardone. Or, he might opt for sending another diplomat to Turkey. the writer says that the third alternative was the most likely one.

The writer says that the decision of Washington was expected to be made after the meeting of Foreign Minister Ahmet Davutoğlu and US Secretary of State Hillary Clinton.

Washington has to make a decision: How much sacrifice will it make in the appointment of a new ambassador. This decision will give clues about US attitudes towards Turkey, the writer notes. (Milliyet 29.11)

'Tribune of Anatolia': Diplomatic Cables Reveal US Doubts about Turkey's Government

The leaked diplomatic cables reveal that US diplomats are skeptical about Turkey's dependability as a partner. The leadership in Ankara is depicted as divided and permeated by Islamists.

US diplomats have grave doubts about Turkey's dependability. Secret or confidential cables from the US Embassy in Ankara describe Islamist tendencies in the government of Prime Minister Recep Tayyip Erdogan.

The US diplomats' verdict on the NATO partner with the second biggest army in the alliance is devastating. The Turkish leadership is depicted as divided, and Erdogan's advisers, as well as Foreign Minister Ahmet Davutoglu, are portrayed as having little understanding of politics beyond Ankara.

The Americans are also worried about Davutoglu's alleged neo-Ottoman visions. A

high-ranking government adviser warned in discussions, quoted by the US diplomats, that Davutoglu would use his Islamist influence on Erdogan, describing him as "exceptionally dangerous." According to the US document, another adviser to the ruling AKP party remarked, probably ironically, that Turkey wanted "to take back Andalusia and avenge the defeat at the siege of Vienna in 1683." The US diplomats write that many leading figures in the AKP were members of a Muslim fraternity and that Erdogan had appointed Islamist bankers to influential positions. He gets his information almost exclusively from newspapers with close links to Islamists, they reported. The prime minister, the cables continue, has surrounded himself with an "iron ring of sycophantic (but contemptuous) advisors" and presents himself as the "Tribune of Anatolia."

Turkish Foreign Minister Ahmet Davutoğlu flew to Washington over the weekend to receive an award from Foreign Policy magazine, which nominated him as one of their "Top 100 Global Thinkers."

On Monday and Tuesday, he will also meet with U.S. Secretary State Hillary Clinton, National Security Advisor Tom Donilon, various members of the U.S. Congress and journalists. He is expected to give talks at foreign policy think-tanks and speak to students at Georgetown University.

"This is the most comprehensive trip to Washington ever planned for a Turkish foreign minister," Turkish journalist Murat Yetkin said, writing in the daily

Two hot issues

The trip comes at a time when Turkish-American relations have been strained due to two key issues: first, the nuclear-swap deal Turkey and Brazil signed with Iran last May, which did not receive the backing Ankara expected from the U.S. government. As a result, Turkey, along with Brazil, voted "no" to U.N. Security Council sanctions on Iran, diverging from the United States and other permanent Security Council members.

The second issue is Turkey's tense relations with Israel.

"On the Israel issue, we are not responsible for the problem, and we are not the party which needs to take a step," Davutoğlu told the Hürriyet Daily News & Economic Review on his way to Washington.

"Israeli forces killed nine civilians in the open sea, and we need an apology for that first," he said, referring to the Free Gaza flotilla incident of last May.

Davutoğlu said that just before the incident he was planning to meet Israeli Prime Minister Netanyahu in New York in order to put the indirect Israel-Syria peace talks that Turkey had facilitated back on track.

"When we heard about the killings, I cancelled the meeting with Netanyahu and instead headed to the United Nations" to make a strong condemnation of the Israeli act, Davutoğlu said.

On the Iran issue, Davutoğlu emphasized that Turkey's goal was to find a diplomatic solution to the tension raised by Iran's nuclear program. He voiced strong support for the "engagement" policy of U.S. President Barack Obama and added that Turkey sincerely wanted to help that policy succeed.

"We indeed work closely with the Obama administration in various areas," Davutoğlu said, arguing that the media attention on a few differences between Ankara and Washington misses the larger picture.

He also criticized some recent comments in the Turkish media which had argued that an "angry" U.S. Congress would make Turkey "pay a price." Davutoğlu said Turks needed to overcome this complex and start to think more self-confidently. "America is stronger than us," he said, "but it is not our superior."

Zero problems?

Davutoğlu has been widely known for his "zero problems with neighbors" concept, which initiated a new active era in Turkish foreign policy.

"They call me Mr. Zero Problems," said Davutoğlu, contentedly, as an academic who had the chance to implement his foreign policy theories in the actual world. He told how the "zero problems" concept had helped relations with Greece, Russia, Georgia, Syria, Iran, Iraq, as well as the regional government in northern Iraq.

Noting these successes, Davutoğlu admitted that the zero-problems policy was not a fully fulfilled goal yet, but rather an ideal that Turkey would continue to work for. "Such new conceptualizations in foreign policy lead to new mindsets," he also said, "and these mindsets help realize the concept itself."

With regards to Armenia, he said the protocols Ankara signed with Yerevan "remain valid," and would hopefully be realized.

After his meetings in Washington, Davutoğlu is expected to fly to Kazakhstan on Tuesday night for an international meeting.

There have been no references to Canadian political leadership or Canada-U.S. issues. Although the Canadian press has reported on the Canadian angle in two of the Afghan reports, there has been no reference here.
Communications
During the afternoon, the Canadian media continued to focus on statements by both Minister Cannon and U.S. Secretary of State Hillary Clinton regarding the effect of the leaked documents on U.S. relations with other countries.

Twitter comments on the issue mainly posted links to articles discussing the leaked documents. Of note, several tweets linked to a GeoNewBlog post explaining several world governments http://www.geonewsblog.com/2010/11/30/aus-canada-iraq-condemn-wikileaks/?utm_source=geonewblog.com&utm_medium=twitter, including Canada, condemned the leaked documents.

A report on Connect with Mark Kelley stated the US is downplaying the impact of the cables on diplomatic relations. US officials are taking a different stance this evening with Hillary Clinton saying foreign political leaders understand that "without the ability to speak frankly, diplomacy can't work."

Der Spiegel hasposted a Q&A http://www.spiegel.de/politik/ausland/0,1518,731177,00.html about the 'Embassy Files' release. Among the details:

*Included are 251,287 cables and 8,000 diplomatic directives *One cable dates back to 1966, but most are newer than 2004

*9,005 documents date from the first two months of 2010 *Der Spiegel, The New York Times, The Guardian, Le Monde and El Pas have had access to the files and reviewed them.

None of the documents are classified 'Top Secret', but only 'Secret' at the highest clssification rating. This was also confirmed by Politico's White House correspondent Mike Allen onTwitter https://twitter.com/#!/mikeallen/status/8539364191633408, quoting the US administration.

According to Der Spiegel, just over half of the cables are not subject to classification, 40.5 percent are classified as "confidential" and only six percent or 15,652 dispatches as "secret." 2.5 million U.S. employees have access to SIPRNET material, where these cables originated.

A graphical representation of the worldwide distribution of the cables appears on the Spiegel site.

Der Spiegel is expected to go live with the full edition at 22:30 Sunday, local time.

 Der Spiegel and Le Monde are reporting also on US views of Turkey. The NY Times and Le Monde are reporting on US views on French President Sarkozy.
- A search of tags (key words included in the document header to which we have access) reveals a minimum of 2,648 documents referencing Canada, including:

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- The WikiLeaks Taskforce has analysed 75 key words identified on the CBC website for the number of meetings and key subjects discussed. Interested Departments should contact the WikiLeaks Task Force.
- MINA fielded two questions in Question Period (see attached transcript).

Communications

New information about Canada in the media this evening was included in the Manchester Guardian http://www.guardian.co.uk/world/2010/nov/30/gordon-brown-the-us-embassy-cables. The note explains both Prime Ministers Harper and Gordon Brown were invited to a D-Day celebration in Paris because they were in "political trouble at home." Canadian news aggregator website National Newswatch linked to this article the moment it was released.

There was little new WikiLeaks-related information discussed by the media. Articles discussing the topic tended to report on relations between China and North Korea, U.S. and UK fears over Pakistan nuclear arms and the fate of WikiLeaks founder Julian Assange. There were no new Canada-related WikiLeaks developments on Twitter.

Communications

A significant number of dailies reported Minister Cannon downplayed the effects of the release of U.S. diplomatic cables by website WikiLeaks on Canada-U.S. relations. The articles noted that while condemning the release of documents by WikiLeaks, Minister Cannon touted the strength of the relationship between Canada and the U.S.

Canadian broadcast featured brief analyses on the content of the documents,

At least one mentions Canadian troops: "When we went there in May and June 2006, the Americans and Canadians had been there for some years and had been banned from going into the centre of Sanguin the whole time because it was too dangerous and too provocative, they never took charge of the place. It was a dangerous place that the Americans never took care of. It still is, after four and a half years, the most dangerous place in Helmand, we lost a third of our casualties there.

To date the media has focussed on WikiLeaks files reporting on negotiations leading up to former President Nelson Mandela's release from prison, his personal priorities (such as an early meeting with UK PM Margaret Thatcher) internal ANC dynamics during that period and the important question of access to Mandela following his release.

Neither the African National Congress (ANC, the governing party) nor the Government of South Africa have commented on the leaked material. When contacted by the media yesterday, the Spokesperson for the Department of International Relations and Cooperation (DIRCO) said: "It is the policy of this government not to comment on leaks."

No Canadian multilateral or bilateral interests have been impacted nor has there been any specific mention or relevance to Canada of issues raised to date.

PARIS A French official says the government will change the way it sends diplomatic missives in the aftermath of the latest publications by WikiLeaks.

Francois Baroin says the country will change its methods for dispatching such documents but has not provided further details.

Baroin briefed reporters after a Cabinet meeting Tuesday. He says President Nicolas Sarkozy told ministers that the release of the WikiLeaks documents is the ``height of irresponsibility.''

Baroin said the French government is in contact with the U.S. about the issue.

This weekend, WikiLeaks began publishing more than 250,000 leaked United States embassy cables a cache it says is the largest set of confidential documents ever released into the public domain.

SUBJECT:

Deputy Minister's Breakfast - Wikileaks Update

SUMMARY: The release by the website "Wikileaks" of a cache of US State Department diplomatic reporting will have a significant impact on the US and its bilateral and multilateral relationships. A release of documents specific to Canada is expected this week. DFAIT is coordinating the Government of Canada's reaction to developments. OGDs will be kept informed of developments as well as DFAIT's approach as it evolves.

BACKGROUND:

WikiLeaks has begun loading their website with approximately 250,000 documents, thousands of which are expected to reference Canada, and will contain sensitive information. DFAIT is reviewing all documents for any impact that they may have on Canada, Canadians, our bilateral interests and Government of Canada staff, and is coordinating the Government of Canada response to developments.

TALKING POINTS:

DFAIT is coordinating the Government of Canada's response to developments, including communications (media coverage, inquiries, response), determining impact on Canadian interests and key international developments and reactions.

Canada has been engaged with the US to manage the outcome of this unfortunate development. Minister Cannon has been briefed by Secretary Clinton, and the Department is in close contact with the State Department.

DFAIT has established a Task Force to manage DFAIT's secure downloading, analysis and appropriate response to materials relating to Canadian interests and policy.

The Wikileaks Task Force includes staff from geographic, multilateral and functional bureaux who will analyse the material.

The Task Force will engage members of the OGD community as issues related to their interests arise. The Associate Deputy Minister of Foreign Affairs and I are briefing a number of you on a daily basis on key developments, communications, impact on Canadian interests as well as on international development and reactions.

Heads of Mission are being contacted directly by the relevant geographic team for input to determine host country reactions to leaked information as it pertains to relevant bilateral and

DFAIT is working on a protocol to address situations where employees are named in leaked reports. The protocol will be shared with OGDs on Wednesday.

This list draws on the metadata available on the CBC website to identify the nature of the leaked cables that refer to Canada. Partners could either review this list, or the higher level categories on the CBC website, to identify areas of specific interest.

Guidance for Employees who have been named in Wikileaks leaked cables

It is anticipated that Canadian government employees will be referenced in the context of the leaked cables. DFAIT is developing a protocol to address situations where our employees are named in this context. It will include: contacting employees, support from human resources, media relations guidance, as well as considering personal and mission security implications. DFAIT will share this protocol with partner departments once finalized (Thursday or earlier).

Liaison Officers

A message has been prepared to all government departments asap Wednesday with an update and requesting that they identify liaison officers to DFAIT to be on-site or on call if and when the full downloading of Canadian-related documents occurs on Wikilinks.

IT Security

DFAIT continues to block Wikileaks to mitigate threat of potential virus from downloading. Discussion at yesterday's meeting referred to broader considerations across government. Unless otherwised advised by Centre/CSEC, DFAIT will continue to block.

Media

DFAIT Comms liaising with PCO further to yesterday's conversation re: media outreach. PCO may provide an update.

Security Management of Wikileaks Documents

Although documents appearing on Wikileaks are in the public domain, they continue to carry their original classification. and should be managed as such (electronic and hard copies). This has been the US practice during past Wikileaks and they have confirmed continuation of this policy. You may wish to make this point to ensure that partners are cognizant of this practice. This point is included in the outgoing message from you to OGDs.

ISLAMABAD: The Canadian Security Intelligence Service (CSIS) told the United States that among other things, the main domestic focus of the agency was recruitment of a small number of Canadian "wannabes" of Pakistani origin for mostly overseas operations.

CSIS Director Jim Judd informed Dr Eliot Cohen, Counselor of the State Department in Ottawa, that Canada's ethnic Pakistani community was unlike its ghettoised and poorly educated UK counterpart and was unlikely to engage in domestic terror plots, as per the July 2008 cable of the US Embassy in Canada included in the Wikileaks disclosures.

Judd told Cohen that the Pakistani community in Canada was largely made up of traders, lawyers, doctors, engineers and others who see promise for themselves and their children in North America, so its members were unlikely to engage in domestic terror plots.

Therefore, Judd said, the main domestic focus of the CSIS, Canada's lead agency for national security intelligence, is instead on fundraising and procurement, as well as the recruitment of a small number of Canadian "wannabes" of Pakistani origin for mostly overseas operations.

Cohen briefed his recent trip to Islamabad and Peshawar, noting his alarm at the degrading economic, political, and security situation there, and its implications for Pakistan, Afghan, and regional stability. Judd responded that Cohen's sober assessment tracked with the CSIS' own view of Pakistan, and that "it is hard to see a good outcome there" due to that country's political, economic and security failures, on top of fast-rising oil and food prices. Canada does not have an explicit strategy for Pakistan, Judd said, but the Privy Council Deputy Secretary David Mulroney (who leads the inter-agency on Afghanistan) now has the lead on developing one. Cohen remarked, and Judd agreed, that it would be necessary to avoid approaching Pakistan as simply an adjunct to the Isaf and OEF missions in Afghanistan.

Judd said that he viewed Momin Khawaja and his "ilk" as outliers, due in part to the fact that Canada's ethnic Pakistani community was unlike its ghettoised and poorly educated UK counterpart. Momin Khawaja has been on trial in Canada for his role in an al-Qaeda UK bomb plot in the first major test of Canada's 2001 Anti-Terrorism Act.

Judd discussed domestic and foreign terror threats with Cohen and admitted that the CSIS was increasingly distracted from its mission by legal challenges that could endanger foreign intelligence-sharing with Canadian

agencies.

He predicted that the upcoming release of a DVD of Guantanamo detainee and Canadian citizen Omar Khadr's interrogation by Canadian officials would lead to heightened pressure on the government to press for his return to Canada, which the government would continue to resist.

Omar Khadr is a well known figure in Canada and elsewhere. Canadian journalist Michelle Shepherd has written a book "Child of Guantanamo Bay" on him. Judd commented that cherry-picked sections of the court-ordered release of a DVD of Khadr would likely show three (Canadian) adults interrogating a kid who breaks down in tears. He observed that the images would no doubt trigger "knee-jerk anti-Americanism" and "paroxysms of moral outrage, a Canadian specialty," as well as lead to a new round of heightened pressure on the government to press for Khadr's return to Canada. He predicted that PM Harper's government would nonetheless continue to resist this pressure.

The CSIS chief shared Cohen's negative assessment of current political, economic, and security trends in Pakistan, and was worried about what it would mean for the Isaf mission in Afghanistan.

The cable said that Canada had begun formulating an inter-agency Pakistan strategy, and the CSIS had agreed to open a channel to Iran's intelligence service which Judd has not yet "figured out."

Cohen and Judd discussed threats posed by violent Islamist groups in Canada, and recent developments in Pakistan and Afghanistan. Judd ascribed an "Alice in Wonderland" worldview to Canadians and their courts, whose judges have tied the CSIS "in knots," making it ever more difficult to detect and prevent terror attacks in Canada and abroad. The situation, he commented, left government security agencies on the defensive and losing public support for their effort to protect Canada and its allies.

To Cohen's query, Judd said, the CSIS had responded to recent, non-specific intelligence on possible terror operations by "vigorously harassing" known Hezbollah members in Canada.

Judd mentioned other major cases that also presented CSIS with major legal headaches due to the use of intelligence products in their development: Momin Khawaja has been on trial for his role in an al-Qaeda UK bomb plot since June 23 in the first major test of Canada's 2001 Anti-Terrorism Act, and Canada's ability to protect intelligence supplied by foreign government sources; the trial of the first of the home-grown Toronto 11 (down from 18) terror plotters, which is also now under way; and the prosecution of Global Islamic Media Front propagandist Said Namouh, who was arrested in Quebec in 2007 for conspiring to conduct bombings in Austria and Germany.

The CSIS is far from being "high-five mode" on Afghanistan, Judd asserted, due in part to Karzai's weak leadership, widespread corruption, the lack of will to press ahead on counter-narcotics, limited Afghan security force capability (particularly the police) and, most recently, the Sarpoza prison break. He commented that the CSIS had seen Sarpoza coming, and its link to the Quetta Shura in Pakistan, but could not get a handle on the timing.

Judd added that he and his colleagues are "very, very worried" about Iran. The CSIS recently talked to Iran's Ministry of Intelligence and Security (MOIS) after that agency requested its own channel of communication to Canada, he said. The Iranians agreed to "help" on Afghan issues, including sharing information regarding potential attacks. However, "we have not figured out what they are up to," Judd confided, since it is clear that the "Iranians want Isaf to bleed...slowly

Dear Colleagues.

This message is further to our communication of November 25 (attached).

As you know, DFAIT has established a Task Force to assess implications for Canadian interests and to respond to requests. The Task Force is monitoring WIKILEAKS and analyzing the data uploaded to the site to determine its relevance to Canada. As a number of departments may be identified in the communications that WikiLeaks makes public in the coming days, we ask that you appoint a liaison officer in order to ensure that documents are properly distributed to officials your respective departments - more information in paragraph 2 below.

1. Some key findings thus far:

- a) Presently, documents posted to WikiLeaks are being released a few at a time, rather than the complete anticipated collection of 250,000+ documents at once, as was expected. So far, some 486 documents have been uploaded. It is unclear at this time if this rate will continue.
- b) From the information released thus far and from news reports, it is our understanding that several media organizations have arranged with WikiLeaks for privileged access to all the material. As such, many documents which relate to Canada could be released in quick succession and we could be faced with news reports using information in documents that have not yet been uploaded to the site.
- c) Based on information that has been reported thus far, it is expected that some 2600 documents relate specifically to Canada. A large number of them may be released later this week, including around the time when the NY Times will reportedly feature commentary on reporting related to Canada (possibly Thursday, December 1).
- 2. Liaison Officers: Given that a large number of documents related to Canada could be released this week, we ask each department to appoint a liaison officer who can remain on call for contact as required by the Task Force. For those departments for which there is expected to be many documents released, liaison officers may be asked to be on-site at DFAIT as required. We ask that you provide to wikileakstaskforce@international.gc.ca contact information for a liaison officer by COB Wednesday, December 1. Liaison officers must have Secret clearance and may be required to analyze the document(s). They will also ensure that documents are properly distributed to officials in their department.

A separate message will be sent to your departments with more detailed information regarding this matter.

- **3. Government of Canada treatment of WikiLeaks documents**: Please note that leaked U.S. documents remain as originally classified and should continue to be managed in that respect.
- **4. Guidance for Employees who have been named in Wikileaks leaked cables**: It is anticipated that Canadian government employees will be referenced in the context of the leaked cables. DFAIT is developing a protocol to address situations where our employees are named in this context. It will include: contacting employees, support from human resources, media relations guidance, as well as considering personal and mission security implications. DFAIT will share this protocol with partner departments once finalized.
- **5. Metadata Analysis**: Where the documents have been tagged with keywords, DFAIT has harvested tags of keywords of interest for all 250,000+ documents. We have compiled those and I will provide them to you. The information references dates and key issues and, to the extent that it will be helpful, may assist departments in developing a rapid response if and when the full documents are made public.

Comme vous le savez, le MAECI a créé un groupe de travail pour évaluer les répercussions sur les intérêts canadiens et pour répondre aux demandes. Le groupe de travail surveille WIKILEAKS et analyse les données qui sont téléchargées sur le site pour déterminer ce qui est pertinent pour le Canada. Comme il se peut qu'un certain nombre de ministères soient nommés dans les communications que WikiLeaks rendra publiques dans les jours qui viennent, nous vous demandons de nommer un agent de liaison qui sera chargé de veiller à ce que les documents soient distribués aux fonctionnaires de vos ministères respectifs – des informations supplémentaires sont fournies au paragraphe 2 ci-dessous.

1. Principales constatations jusqu'à présent :

- a) Pour le moment, les documents sont affichés sur le site de WikiLeaks au compte-gouttes, alors que l'on s'attendait à ce que tous les documents en question (plus de 250 000) le soient simultanément. Jusqu'à présent, quelque 486 documents ont été téléchargés. On ne sait pas pour le moment si la divulgation va se poursuivre à ce rythme.
- b) D'après l'information publiée jusqu'à présent et les déclarations des médias, nous croyons savoir que plusieurs organes de presse se sont entendus avec WikiLeaks pour avoir un accès privilégié à l'ensemble des documents. Ainsi, d'une part, de nombreux documents concernant le Canada pourraient être publiés rapidement et, d'autre part, nous pourrions nous retrouver dans la situation où des articles ou des reportages traiteraient d'information tirée de documents n'ayant pas encore été téléchargés sur le site.
- c) Selon l'information diffusée, on prévoit qu'il y aura quelque 2 600 documents concernant plus particulièrement le Canada. Beaucoup d'entre eux pourraient être publiés plus tard cette semaine, notamment au moment où le New York Times devrait publier un article à leur sujet (peut-être le jeudi 1er décembre).
- 2. Agents de liaison : Étant donné que de nombreux documents concernant le Canada pourraient être publiés cette semaine, nous demandons à chaque ministère de nommer un agent de liaison qui pourra être en attente afin que le groupe de travail puisse communiquer avec lui, selon les besoins. Dans le cas des ministères qui risquent d'être mentionnés dans un grand nombre des documents publiés, il se pourrait que l'on demande aux agents de liaison de travailler au MAECI, selon les besoins. Nous demandons à tous les ministères qu'ils fournissent à wikileakstaskforce@international.gc.ca les coordonnées d'un agent de liaison d'ici le mercredi 1er décembre, à la fermeture des bureaux. Les agents de liaison doivent avoir une cote de sécurité de niveau secret et ils pourraient avoir à analyser des documents. En outre, ils devront veiller à ce que les documents soient distribués aux fonctionnaires de leur ministère comme il convient.

Vos ministères recevront un autre message contenant des renseignements détaillés à ce sujet.

- 3. Traitement des documents de WikiLeaks par le gouvernement du Canada : Sachez que les documents américains diffusés conservent leur classification originale et qu'ils doivent être gérés en conséquence.
- 4. Consignes pour les employés qui ont été nommés dans les câbles diffusés de Wikileaks : On s'attend à ce que les employés du gouvernement du Canada soient

Erdogan Vents Fury at Cable Claims

ISTANBUL—Prime Minister Recep Tayyip Erdoğan of Turkey suggested Wednesday the U.S should fire diplomats who reported claims in leaked State Department cables that he and his family are corrupt, and said he planned to take legal action against them.

In a sometimes furious televised address at the start of an investment conference in Ankara, Mr. Erdoğan said, "My friends in judiciary, and we, are working to do what is necessary about these diplomats. We spoke to the US. They did apologize, but it is not enough. The U.S. should do what is necessary about these diplomats."

"Those who smear us will be crushed under their accusations, they will end, disappear," Mr. Erdoğan said, adding that one person who previously claimed he made \$1 billion in kickbacks as mayor of Istanbul was now awaiting trial as a member of an alleged terrorist organization.

"I don't have a single kurus in Swiss banks. If you prove this, I will resign. But will you stay in your posts?" he said. A kurus is a hundredth of a Turkish lira.

A senior aide to Mr. Erdoğan clarified that lawyers from the justice ministry were examining the feasibility of suing under international, U.S. and Turkish law.

The decision to seek legal action after first playing down the cables and attacking the credibility of WikiLeaks appears to have been triggered by domestic politics ahead of elections next June, and suggests the leaks could have continued fallout for U.S. diplomacy. Opposition party leaders are

demanding that Mr. Erdoğan and his government answer the claims of widespread government corruption in the cables.

Among cables published so far regarding Turkey is one dated Dec. 30, 2004, from former U.S. ambassador Eric Edelman, in which he writes about widespread corruption, naming several ministers from the ruling Justice and Development Party, or AKP.

"We have heard from two contacts that Erdoğan has eight accounts in Swiss banks; his explanations that his wealth comes from the wedding presents guests gave his son and that a Turkish businessman is paying the educational expenses of all four Erdoğan children in the U.S. purely altruistically are lame."

Mr. Edelman couldn't immediately be reached for comment Monday.

Earlier in the year, Mr. Edelman reported claims "that have never been proved" that Mr. Erdoğan had made his fortune by accepting kickbacks as mayor of Istanbul and that he "directly" benefited from the privatization of the state oil-refinery company Tupras.

An unsigned February 2002 cable report named Mr. Erdoğan's brother Mustafa and several close friends of the prime minister as beneficiaries in an Iranian natural-gas pipeline deal. The deal went to a joint venture in which the Turkish party would be a little-known company called Som Petrol.

Mr. Erdoğan on Wednesday also singled out a cable that accused his son-in-law Sadik Albayrak of embezzlement. "The man doesn't know about anything else but writing, they made him a builder," Mr. Erdoğan said.

Addressing opposition leaders, Mr. Erdoğan said it wasn't for him to disprove such claims, but for the people who made or repeated them to prove them. He accused the U.S. ambassador, apparently Mr. Edelman, of bearing a grudge and suggested there was jealousy involved at Turkey's success in securing popularity and influence in the Middle East, Kosovo and other countries.

"If you respect your country and yourself, you will not embrace smears thrown out by foreigners at the prime minister of this country," Mr. Erdoğan said. "An honorable media organization would stand up and ask... 'Honorary Prime Minister, is there something like this. If there is, we will research it.' But if you take action without asking, it would be immorality and worthlessness."

In the documents released by WikiLeaks there were 722 messages from the US Embassy in Portugal. Although their content has not yet been released, 61 concern Portugal and the global terrorist threat, 114 relate to the economic situation in Portugal, 258 on the domestic situation in Portugal (Portuguese legislative elections and Government) and the rest on Afghanistan, NATO, Kosovo, Guantanamo and CIA flights. The two documents so far made public concerning Portugal were from the US Embassies in Brussels and Tripoli concerning the Portuguese position on sanctions onto Iran and the second on Kadhafi's "eccentricities" during a stop in Portugal in September 2009.

The only reference to Canada in the Portuguese press was that Secretary of State Clinton had contacted her Canadian counterpart on WikiLeak.

We understand from the press that Portuguese authorities have been informed by the US Ambassador to NATO about the WikiLeak of documents. We will be having lunch with the America's Division of the Portuguese Foreign Ministry tomorrow and will ask their views on the WikiLeaks messages.

DFAIT PROTOCOL TO ADDRESS SITUATIONS WHERE EMPLOYEES ARE NAMED IN LEAKED REPORTS

OBJECTIVE: to have in place a planned system for identifying, assessing and responding to cases where employees have been named in leaked reports through Wikileaks. It is important that this process be quick, responsive and nimble in order to respond to the range of situations that may emerge.

A Sub-Group of the Wikileaks Task Force (led by Director, Assignments HFP at DFAIT) will assess potential impact when employees are named.

1. INDIVIDUALS WHO MAY BE IDENTIFIED

Current and former employees and appointees of the Government of Canada

2. RESPONSIBILITY FOR IDENTIFYING EMPLOYEES NAMED

- a) Wikileaks Task Force identify employees through review of documents
- b) Communications Bureau media relations alerts when names come up.
- c) **Heads of Mission** if aware that an employee has been or will be named in the WikiLeaks the Head of Mission should advise the Task Force.
- d) Self-identification by current or former employees who contact the Government of Canada

3. ASSESSMENT PROCESS WHEN EMPLOYEES IDENTIFIED

Conducted virtually by a Sub-Group of the Task Force to assess potential impact when employees are named. As soon as information about an individual is available, an assessment will be conducted by the sub-group. It will consider personal safety, legal, human resource and communications issues.

Considerations/ Unit Responsible for Input:

- a) support to employees (Assignments and Executive Management Bureau/HFD, Assignment and Pool Management Division, HFP, Employee Assistance Program, DRCC)
- b) communications media lines, guidance to employees on dealing with media (Media

Relations Office/ BCM)

- c) personal security of employee (Head of Mission, Security Operations and Personal Safety Division/ CSR)
- d) mission security (Head of Mission, Security Operations and Personal Safety Division/CSR)
- e) legal issues- guidance to the Task Force, guidance to employees (Justice Legal Services Division/JUS, Criminal, Security and Diplomatic Law Division/JLA)
- f) geographic / multilateral considerations (Geographic of multilateral Branch, GLD)

4. ACTION/RESPONSE

Based on Sub-Group Assessments, employees, Missions and other Government Department (OGD) partners are contacted with guidance.

- a) Contacting Employees named guidance to employees on personal support, legal, media issues (HFD, HFP, in consultation with Geographic/Multilateral Branch, as appropriate).
- b) Contacting OGDs (HFD to HR/OGD, or other designated contact)
- c) Contacting Heads of Mission
- -Should personal or mission security implications be identified as a result of an employee being named, Heads of Mission will be advised and provided with guidance. (**Departmental Security Officer**, CSD and Security Operations and Personal Safety Division/CSR)

As reported by the local media, approximately 1450 cables issued by the US Embassy in Quito and ranging in dates from October 7, 2009 to February 25, 2010 have yet to be made public on the Wikileaks website.

Speaking to the media on November 29th, Kintto Lucas expressed his support for Assange's work as an investigative reporter an invited him to come to Ecuador and carry out lectures on investigative journalism. He also stated that he would have "no problem" offering Assange residency, should the latter be interested in seeking asylum in Ecuador.

The statements, were quickly picked up by the official government media and transcribed into an official press release. In response, President Correa was quick to clarify that the Vice-Foreign Minister was voicing his own personal opinion and not that of the government. While both the President and the Foreign Minister Ricardo Patino claim that Lucas did not have their authorization to issue such statements the Foreign Minister is also quoted as stating that he "did not discard the possibility of offering temporary asylum to the creator of Wikileaks".

Roxanne / Heidi,

Tomorrow the Wikileaks Task Force Operations Centre ('War Room') will have been operational for one week. Heading into the weekend we will need to take account of the following:

- a) by tomorrow we will have passed the point at which Canada was to be a focus of the document release;
- b) the pace at which the documents are being released by Wikileaks is far below what was anticipated;
- c) media attention is beginning to diminish as the pace of the document release slows;
- d) we have put in place an automated alert system that will scan documents uploaded to Wikileaks for a series of keywords that will act as a trigger to notify us by Blackberry message if there are documents on the site that we need to review on a priority basis.

Given the foregoing it's time to consider whether our current level of effort needs to be recalibrated to better fit the level of work that is required. Here is what I propose:

- 1. The Task Force Contact list is updated and circulated to key individuals.
- 2. Task Force Ops Centre close Friday at 7 pm. The automatic alert system will be active in the event that a message(s) comes in that needs to be reviewed.
- 3. Warren, Ian and I will establish a 24 hour stand-by roster system as will our technical support staff (researchers and IT specialists).
- 4. Starting on Monday morning I will take over full time again as Task Force manager with Ian and Warren going back to their respective divisions (though they would again be on stand-by). We would also have 1 supervisor and 1 researcher in the Task Force room full time for the week.
- 5. We would review the situation again late in the week to determine if we needed to make further adjustments.

A cable from May 2008, one of thousands of secret diplomatic documents released by the WikiLeaks website, describes how President Hosni Mubarak told a U.S. Congressional delegation that everyone in the region was ``terrified" of a nuclear Iran.

Mubarak also cautioned the U.S. against prematurely withdrawing from Iraq as that would live ``Iran in control" and he recommended installing a military dictator in Baghdad.

The cables reveal the extent to which Egypt fears Iranian influence in the region and in an April 2009 discussion with the chairman top U.S. military official, Egypt's intelligence head said Iran was attempting to work inside Egypt.

Key Issues and Findings:

- Since last SitRep, 0 new cables were uploaded to the WikiLeaks site.
- The media with advance access to the WikiLeaks documents continue to feature cables on Afghanistan that have not yet been uploaded to the WikiLeaks site (and that the WikiLeaks task force and FTAG continue to review).
- The WikiLeaks Task Force reminds the SitRep distribution as reported in SitRep 7 of the US State Dept. view that documents posted on WikiLeaks or on media websites continue to carry their designated security classification.

Communications

Ambassador Crosbie's offer to resign, and Prime Minister Harper's support of Crosbie, were the most reported on WikiLeaks-related stories. Some broadcast reports and *Twitter* posts note the RCMP is investigating the leak of Ambassador Crosbie's secret memo. Some *Twitter* posts suggest the memo could have been leaked to Ivison by the government. John Ivison's blog post on the *National Post* explains why it was important to report on the leaked memo. Andrew Potter's post on *Maclean's* says it is more important to look at what prompted Ambassador Crosbie's "outburst".

During a media availability, Prime Minister Harper responded to a question regarding Ambassador Crosbie's comments as follows, "I haven't seen, as I said earlier, I haven't seen all of his comments and all of the documents cited in various newspaper articles. I say this, that the Ambassador, Canada's Ambassadors and high commissioners, their primary responsibility is to represent Canada. Ambassador Crosbie doesn't represent the Government of Afghanistan, he represents the Government of Canada in Afghanistan. And the Government of Canada has been outspoken about some aspects of governance in Afghanistan and we will continue to express those concerns quite emphatically to our counterparts in Afghanistan."

The Globe and Mail and National Post featured A1 reports on Ambassador Crosbie's leaked memo. Substantial coverage on both CBC NN and CTV NC discussed Ambassador Crosbie's reported offer to resign his post. Afghanistan's ambassador to Canada, Jawed Ludin, says William Crosbie's comments will not affect relations between the two countries

El Pais briefly mentions Canada in an article on individuals who were tortured after being detained by the CIA and transferred to prisons overseas, noting the U.K. and Canada granted torture victims millions of dollars in compensation.

CBC's Power Panel condemned Wikileaks for alleged geopolitical destabilization. Former Canadian diplomat Colin Robertson called Julian Assange a "vandal" and described the leaks as "disruptive". Vladimir Putin, interviewed on CNN's Larry King Live, minimized the importance of Wikileaks, noting "this is not a catastrophe". In a CBC interview, Afghan ambassador to Canada Jawed Ludin condemned Wikileaks as damaging. CTV interviewed American ambassador to Canada David Jacobson. He both condemns wikileaks as "shameful", and re-affirmed Canada's strong relationship with the United States.

REPORT:

2. There has been swift, broad media coverage in Mexico, although a relatively restrained reaction from the GOM (about the whole issue in general, not specifically as it pertains to Mexico). An official communiqué was posted on the SRE website late Thursday afternoon (see copy also attached) which "rejects categorically the illegal revelation of documents whose origin is attributed to the US diplomatic service". The communiqué goes on to observe that by their very nature, such communications are confidential and form part of diplomatic practice of all countries. Furthermore, it underlines that information in the documents may be partial or inexact, taken out of context, or subjective depending on the author and the criteria guiding the writer. However, in some of the documents "deplorable practices" are observed from the point of view of "the respect which should govern cooperation between nations with common objectives". The communiqué ends with the statement that the GOM considers that these releases in general represent for the majority of countries in the world "a serious challenge to the constructive and harmonious conduct of diplomatic activities and international relations as a whole". Just before leaving for Argentina, President Calderón said "I am worried by the US espionage - they have always meddled in things - and I worry about what they said. There have been some truly deplorable things, like what they said about my colleague, the President of Argentina, for example, which is unacceptable".

Wikileak and Local Coverage in El Salvador

The local newspapers have covered the entire wikileaks incident but up until yesterday, none of the documents nor the comments had a real connection with El Salvador. However, yesterday, "El Diario de Hoy" reported that one document revealed by the Wikileaks refers to the meeting that took place in June 2009 in El Salvador. The theme was Honduras/Manuel Zelaya and the meeting was attended by Alba related countries, with the notable presence of Salvadorian President Mauricio Funes. This meeting was labelled as "unsuccessful" and the report apparently explains how this meeting had been used by the Argentinian President, Cristina Fernandez de Kirchner, as a "smoke screen" in order to switch the attention from a political defeat in her country.

2. Nothing specific to report. Reporting on Canada-US documents is very much the same as we see everywhere.

- 3. Yesterday, Minister of Foreign affairs Hugo Martinez finally commented the entire wikileak incident and basically said: "... there are several factors at play in this. For one, all diplomatic missions send reports to their headquarters where they assess scenarios and events happening in the host country. This is not a problem, it all depends on the style of writing of the public servants, or even on the style of each country." However, Minister Martinez believes that what makes this a complicated issue is the fact that the contents revealed are threatening operations that are still in development as well as the identity of people who are participating in such operations. He fears that lives could be in danger, for example, in the case of anti-terrorism operations.
- 4. MFA Martínez emphasized that his declarations were not to be considered as accusations against the United States of America. It is his opinion that the Wikileaks cie is the one causing the problems by filtering diplomatic secrets of various States, including El Salvador.

Thursday came and went, and the release of Canadian documents was minimal with no impact on the overall relationship. In anything, coverage in the U.S. media tended to be "tongue in cheek" in nature, describing the cultural dimension of the bilateral relationship: depictions of the U.S. in Canadian television and manifestions of the Canadian inferiority complex. Last night, the *CBC* website published a poll asking "Should the WikiLeaks document release be treated as a threat to national security or legitimate journalism?" 70.9 percent of respondents said it was "legitimate journalism."

The *Globe and Mail* published an op-ed supporting Ambassador Crosbie. This article was posted and re-tweeted several times on Twitter.

Melissa Lantsman, Minister Cannon's Director of Communications, confirmed the RCMP is

investigating who leaked a memo sent by Ambassador Crosbie to DFAIT headquarters.

Regarding his comments in WikiLeaks documents, Liberal and NDP MPs publicly defended and reiterated their support for Ambassador Crosbie.

No new information concerning Canada was published on the WikiLeaks main site.

The WikiLeaks Task Force Operations Centre will produce another SitRep prior to closing.

1. Wikileaks continues to be a key story for most UK media outlets today, but no longer the front page of every newspaper. Unflattering US views of former Prime Minister Gordon Brown are a central theme.

- 2. Another key theme is Afghanistan, with stories largely but not exclusively based on the Eikenberry cables. Canada is mentioned in several pieces although the focus is chiefly on:
- President Karzai's and the US Commander of ISAF's comments that UK troops failed to secure Helmand,
- pervasive corruption at the highest levels,
- negative personal profiles of President Karzai, and
- Afghan-Iran links.
- 3. The Guardian and the Telegraph mention Eikenberry's cable reporting on his meeting with Ambassador Bill Crosbie. On its website, The Guardian has the full cable with a piece entitled "Canadian ambassador expresses serious doubts about Karzai".

6. The only piece which mentions the Canada-US relationship was found in the Daily Mail, which reported on the cable from a US diplomat about negative US images on Canadian television. It also refers to former US Ambassador David Wilkin's comment that, "You're talking about 200,000 cables from the embassy in Ottawa on Canada and about the only thing that's being talked about is a three page cable out Canadian media. If that's all that's being talked about, we have a pretty good relationship." The piece notes that Wilkins did not write, approve or remember the cable in question.

By shifting its focus from military maladministration to diplomatic indiscretion, WikiLeaks is testing the boundaries of its public support round the world, judging from a broad sweep of international reaction.

Publication of a cache **of more than 250,000 US embassy cables** has divided opinion more evenly than did the website's release earlier this year of 76,000 documents connected to the Afghan conflict and 400,000 from the war in Iraq.

Some regard all the leaks as being of equal merit.

Seamus Milne, a leader writer in the **Guardian**, one of five newspapers given access to the documents, said on Thursday that WikiLeaks "is holding US global power to account".

But others believe there is a distinction between the first two leaks and the latest, nicknamed Cablegate on social media forums.

Michael Clarke, the director of the Royal United Services Institute, a defence and security think-tank in London, said an informal poll of fellow analysts led him to conclude that Julian Assange, founder of WikiLeaks, had erred with such an indiscriminate release.

"With the Afghan and Iraq material, there were just a few questions as to whether small parts of it might be irresponsible because they might put people's lives in danger. With this material, where there is little evidence of wrongdoing, I think it wholly steps over the line into irresponsibility.

No formal polling has been done in any countries affected yet, but the public does not seem to have found consensus.

In August, after **WikiLeaks' Afghan release**, a Pew Research Centre poll found that 42 per cent of those who had heard about the leak supported it, but 47 per cent believed that it harmed the public interest. Older respondents were more critical.

In an online poll in the Jersey Journal, a US newspaper website, 60 per cent of respondents thought Mr Assange should be prosecuted for espionage, but a poll for the New York Daily News found that 70 per cent of people thought WikiLeaks was right.

Mr Assange told Time magazine this week: "I think the response by the American public has been very favourable to our endeavour."

A good proportion of users of the magazine's website seem to agree, with Mr Assange running third in its informal voting for Person of the Year, a little behind pop star Lady Gaga and a long way behind the Turkish prime minister, Reçep Tayyip Erdogan, who appears to be benefiting from a campaign of online voting.

Paul Levinson, professor of communications at Fordham University in New York, said US public opinion had split along political lines.

"The right wing is calling [Assange] a traitor and lashing out at the New York Times for publishing ... progressives [say] it's worth taking the risk to national security to hold government to stricter account."

Newspaper editorials globally have tended to oppose the latest leaks.

Canada's Globe and Mail wrote: "Disclosure of written government secrets can still be a very good thing [but] these leaks... are of a different character. They are not primarily military in nature, nor are they the cries of whistleblowers or carefully constructed paper trails."

A poll in Maclean's magazine in Canada found people supporting WikiLeaks by 40 per cent to 35 per cent.

In Germany, the mass-market newspaper Bild accused Mr Assange of hypocrisy and anarchy "[The] disturbing thing is: an entity like WikiLeaks can only exist in the free world. Despots and dictators would not allow it."

But the liberal daily Tageszeitung said that it was wrong to demonise WikiLeaks, which was just following the same rules that good journalists follow.

In the Middle East, reaction was more nuanced.

"We already know everything that was said, but publishing it like this gives it more credibility," said Fahmy Howeidi, an Egyptian commentator.

In Asia, Singapore's state-supervised Straits Times said WikiLeaks' claim to be defending freedom of speech were "pompous self-serving rubbish". It added: "Mr Assange and his associates are not freedom fighters. They merely provide a platform for stolen documents".

Indian news outlets have picked up on a story appearing in the New Zealand media regarding a leaked cable from former US Ambassador to India, David Mulford, in the aftermath of the 26/11 Mumbai terrorist attack. This cable was a report on a meeting between New Zealand, US, Australian, British and **Canadian** diplomats based in Delhi. The Indian media story focuses on how foreign diplomats planned a response to 26/11 that would avoid being "sucked into the Indo-Pak blame game". This story has been picked up on Indian wire services and appears on the websites of many Indian dailies. DELHI has received one related media query. So far, there has been no public Government of India reaction to this leaked cable and related news coverage.

For ease of reference, the full Indian wire service story is copied below along with a link to the original New Zealand story.

How foreign diplomats charted response to 26/11: WikiLeaks

In the aftermath of 26/11, diplomats from U.S., Australia, New Zealand, U.K. and **Canada** had decided not to get "sucked into" the Indo-Pak blame game and stop short of blasting India on the huge intelligence failure, disclosures by WikiLeaks show, according to New Zealand media.

A confidential cable released by WikiLeaks relating to the Mumbai terror attack relates to the international response to the deadly incident that killed 183 people, including foreigners. The cable from December 2008 describes a meeting between New Zealand, US, Australian, British and **Canadian** diplomats in the aftermath of the attacks, according to New Zealand Herald. All the representatives resolved not to get "sucked into the blame game" being played by Pakistan and India, the cable said.

It said the representatives decided that any offers of assistance to India should be made "carefully" to avoid being interpreted as politically motivated. They had earlier agreed to send sympathetic messages to India rather than "pound" it for the "massive intelligence failure" that led to the attacks, it said. In the leaked cable, US ambassador to India David Mulford speculated on whether the attacks were ordered by Pakistan's intelligence service ISI.

In a segment titled "The Million Dollar Question", he noted links between Pakistan intelligence and the extremist group that perpetrated them, LeT. However, he said "there is no clear evidence yet to suggest that ISI directed or facilitated the attacks".





1. After a weekend where much of the space given to the WikiLeaks story was the legal situation of Julian Assange, Monday's focus was on the anger of US authorities following the release of a list of the US' key industries and assets. That story was on the front of many UK newspapers, including the Times, and led the BBC hourly broadcasts. They report that Assange is likely located somewhere in the UK. Overall, the mentions of Canada tend to be in passing.

2. In an editorial defending the release of the cables, a Guardian editorial calls attention to the comments made by Prof. Tom Flanagan, which they said he later regretted. The Telegraph also makes reference to the comments in a story focusing on possible upcoming leaks. The Guardian referred to him as a "former advisor" to the PM and The Telegraph simply referred to him as a "pundit".

US counts cost in week of leaks - Financial Times

A week of WikiLeaks has left a host of memorable images in its wake.

Vladimir Putin and Dmitry Medvedev, the prime minister-president tandem running Russia, are depicted as Batman and Robin. King Abdullah of Saudi Arabia reportedly calls for an attack on Iran "to cut off the head off the snake". A weary US embassy in Rome complains of a "barrage of Berlusconisms" when the Italian prime minister defends his good friend Mr Putin a little too ardently.

But the longer-lasting impact of what is set to be the world's biggest leak – of some 251,287 documents – is less clear.

WikiLeaks itself has published only a tiny proportion of that total: 667, as of Friday afternoon. As the group plaintively remarks in an appeal for cash to speed up its efforts: "At one cable per hour, it will take WikiLeaks 28.6 years to release them all." At that rate, many of the cables will have been declassified long before WikiLeaks gets round to releasing them.

One consequence of this drip-by-drip release is exaggeration and distortion of some claims, such as the hearsay filtered through a South Korean vice-foreign minister that China might accept a reunified Korea.

The release of such a huge archive has, on the other hand, given the world an unparalleled view into US dealings with its allies and partners.

"It has done damage," lamented William Burns, the top US professional diplomat, who as ambassador to Moscow oversaw the dispatch of many of the now leaked cables on Mr Putin. "Confidentiality of conversations is at the core of what we do as diplomats, just as it is for journalists or doctors or lawyers or others."

In one cable, Mr Berlusconi allegedly characterises President Nicolas Sarkozy of France as a "waning" force. In another dispatch Mohammed bin Zayed, Abu Dhabi's crown prince, reportedly calls for a ground invasion of Iran.

Franco Frattini, Italy's foreign minister, called the leak the "9-11 of diplomacy". Recep Tayyip Erdogan, Turkey's prime minister, said: "Those who throw slanders at us for things we didn't do will be crushed by their own slanders. They will be destroyed."

Over the past week Hillary Clinton, US secretary of state, has spent much time apologising to the foreign ministers or presidents of France, Liberia, Canada, Argentina, China, Pakistan, Saudi Arabia and the UK.

Julian Assange, WikiLeaks founder, often argues that he is fighting a battle for openness and transparency. But in the US the leak has galvanised support for greater, not less, control over official information. The pooling of data between bureaucracies, introduced after the September 11 2001 attacks, has been reined in.

Federal employees have even been told not to download the WikiLeaks cables. The new Republican leadership of the House of Representatives has already asked Mrs Clinton to testify on how she how she will toughen up on controls.

Finally, there is the effect on the US's image around the globe. One state department cable outlined new rules for human intelligence and seemed to ask US diplomats to gather information on their counterparts, down to their frequent flyer and credit card numbers. The cable in question has been neither fully explained nor defended.

Other than that, there is little evidence of US skulduggery – or of an agenda very different from that publicly advanced.

On Iran, diplomats look for alternatives to military action.

On Russia, they seek co-operation with a partner not fully trusted. The cables themselves sometimes read like relics of a past era: chatty summaries of the local press and gossip. Such communications should not be confused with the more valuable information gathered by the \$53bn US national intelligence programme.

But all the same, the public response to the WikiLeaks archive may mirror some US officials' response when they read intelligence reports after assuming office: "Oh my God, is this the best we've got?"

HEADLINING ROLE

It would not be surprising if Julian Assange, WikiLeaks' founder, wished to forget the week in which Interpol made public its "wanted" notice for him and Amazon.com threw the website off its server, writes Daniel Dombey in

Washington.

But instead he seems to have enjoyed every moment. By all accounts, Mr Assange relishes being US enemy number one.

In an interview with Time magazine this week, the 39-year-old argued people had changed their perceptions of many countries. He even suggested talks with Iran this weekend were a result of the leak and added the release could bolster the Israeli-Palestinian peace process.

Polish official and media reaction to the Wikileaks release of US diplomatic cables has been relatively mild. Beyond standard reports on potential implications for US diplomacy globally, key focus of media has been on US efforts toward a 'reset' with Russia and degree to which this may have impacted relations and plans (notably for missle defence installations) with Poland and other central European states. Polish FM Silorski was quick to condemn the leaks and affirm that they will in no way affect 'close relations with our American partners.' The only official comment to raise eyebrows was PM Tusk's acknowledgement when questioned that 'I'm worried, if it really is true, that the US may have made decisions about our security with mainly its relations with Russia in mind and not the objective security of NATO allies.' Media have not failed to highlight that Poland comes out looking very good so far, in reference to cables reportedly indicating US surprise at strong Polish leadership during the 2008 Russia-Georgia conflict notably in shoring up regional solidarity with Tblisi. There have been no official or media references to Canada beyond passing mention of cables from the US embassy in Ottawa of which you will be well aware.

- The Wikileaks website continues to publish classified and unclassified US diplomatic cables though at a slower pace than had originally been expected. To date over **1,000** of an estimated total of 250,000 US documents in the possession of Wikileaks have been posted on its site. Of those, **only 8** have been identified as being of relevance to Canada.
- Data released by Wikileaks indicates that Canada is tagged in approximately 2,600 documents (meaning Canada is one of the subjects of the cable).

- Minister Cannon will continue to assert that these are not Canadian documents and that he will not comment on operational matters.
- The site itself remains the target of unrelenting cyber attacks hindering its ability to post new material. It's ability to accept donations necessary to finance its activities has also been constrained as some online payment services have stopped Wikileaks from accessing their site.
- Meanwhile the founder of Wikileaks, Julian Assange, remains in a British jail awaiting a decision on whether or not he will be extradited to Sweden to face criminal charges. A Wikileaks spokesman was quoted today as saying that the document uploads will continue despite Assange's arrest.
- Assange himself has indicated several times over the course of the last few
 days that many thousands of people have downloaded from the Wikileaks
 site an encrypted file containing some of the most explosive and politically
 damaging US documents. He is calling this his "Insurance file" and is
 threatening to send out the password to unlock the contents of the file should
 the authorities succeed in shutting down Wikileaks site. The cache of
 documents is rumoured to include materials on BP and Guantanamo.
- The media outlets that have had access to all the Wikileaks documents (NY Times, Guardian, Le Monde, El Pais, Der Spiegel) continue to publish stories based, in many cases, on documents that have not yet been uploaded to the site.

- Julian Assange, remains in a British jail awaiting a decision on whether or not he will be
 extradited to Sweden to face criminal charges. A Wikileaks spokesman was quoted today
 as saying that the document uploads will continue despite Assange's arrest.
- Assange himself has indicated several times over the course of the last few days that
 many thousands of people have downloaded from the Wikileaks site an encrypted file
 containing some of the most explosive and politically damaging US documents. He is
 calling this his "Insurance file" and is threatening to send out the password to unlock the
 contents of the file should the authorities succeed in shutting down Wikileaks site. The
 cache of documents is rumoured to include materials on BP and Guantanamo.

- US embassy cables revealed America's ongoing battle to stem the flow of arms from eastern Europe to the Middle East.

New York Times

- A week after Syria's president, Bashar al-Assad, assured a top US state department official that his country was not sending weapons to Hezbollah in Lebanon, the Obama Adminsitration lodged a confidential protest accusing Damascus of doing precisely that.
- US diplomats expressed concern that huge cargo planes operated by Badr Airlines of Sudan were flying weapons from Tehran to Khartoum, from where they were shipped to Hamas in Gaza. The US asked countries in the region to deny overflight rights to the airlines. Jordan and several other countries agreed, but Yemen declined, a February 2009 cable reported.

El Pais (Spain)

- Spain is worried by the prospect of Mauratania becoming a failed state, a "second Somalia".
- The US Embassy in Nicaragua describes the country as a corrupt criminal state financed by drugs and "suitcases full of money sent by President Hugo Chávez of Venezuela.

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President Daniel Ortega is seen as unhinged and obsessed by his own security.

The Wikileaks Task Force Operations Centre will close at 6 pm and re-open at 8:30 am tomorrow. The Task Force continues a 24/7 monitoring of the Wikileaks site with automatic alerts for documents uploaded with key Canadian content.



The site itself remains the target of cyber attacks hindering its ability to post new material. It's ability to accept donations necessary to finance its activities has also been constrained as some online payment facilities have withdrawn their service to Wikileaks. Meanwhile the founder of Wikileaks, Julian Assange, remains in a British jail awaiting a decision on whether or not he will be extradited to Sweden to face criminal charges.

The media outlets that have had access to all the Wikileaks documents (NY Times, Guardian, Le Monde, El Pais, Der Spiegel) continue to publish stories based, in many cases, on documents that have not yet been uploaded to the site.

The publication of these documents has caused considerable embarrassment to the United States. Secretary of State Clinton however has underscored that these communications shouldn't be confused with US foreign policy which is set by decision makers in Washington.

Canada and Wikileaks

To date over 1,000 of an estimated total of 250,000 US documents in the possession of Wikileaks have been posted on its site (this is less than .5%). Of those, only 8 have been identified as being of relevance to Canada or where Canada was a principal subject. These include reports on a meeting with former CSIS Director Jim Judd and a report from the US Embassy in Kabul which referred extensively to comments made by Ambassador Crosbie.

An analysis of some of the data that has been released by Wikileaks suggests that upwards of 2,500 documents could include references to Canada.

Finally, we should not discount the possibility that additional US documents relating to Canada and or Mexico could be released by Wikileaks in advance of, or during, the Foreign Ministers meeting.

Canada will not comment on operational matters. Canada and the United States enjoy one of the closest and most extensive bilateral relationships in the world.

US POSITION:

Secretary Clinton has stated that the illegal disclosure of these documents puts people's lives in danger, threatens US national security, and undermines their efforts to work with other countries to solve shared problems.

She also suggested that this was an attack on the international community – "the alliances and partnerships, the conversations and negotiations, that safeguard global security and advance economic prosperity."

They are taking aggressive steps to hold responsible those who stole the information and to put in place new security safeguards to ensure that this breach of security is not repeated.

Hope this e-mail finds you well.

In the wake of the recent WIKILEAKS, DFAIT senior management is keen on taking all necessary action to ensure proper protocoles are in place with respect to the proper use of DFAIT communication systems, adequate distribution of documents, and controls on both removals as well as onward transmission of secured communications to intended recipients.

To that end, IFM and DCD/GLD have been asked to produce a set of recommendations for the review of Executive Council, on December 20th.

In discussing how best to approach this task, DMA reminded us that you had done some considerable work in the wake of both NAFTAGATE and cyber attacks last Spring. I believe you might have produced some recommendations for the review of deputies at the time.

We were thus wondering whether you would consider stepping back into this file, as a consultant, to refresh your work and analysis, and possibly add new recommendations, notably on greater controls on distribution of secured material.

Your successor as CSD, Artur Wilczinsky, Gaston Barban as CIO, Heidi Kutz as DG for the geographics, and myself as corporate secretary, would be pleased to work closely with you to achieve a very practical set of recommendations.

More specifically, we had in mind a detailed deck, structured along the following lines:

What is the current infrastructure to support the production, circulation and storing of classified documents. What are the risks and vulnerabilities associated with the present set up.

What could be done to improve the integrity of our system, from the point of view of:

- a) Technology
- b) Corporate practices (use of pre-populated templates, eliminating the reply to all practice/capability, restricting onward transmission capability, training
 - c) Enforcement

The "Operation Payback" attack on websites accused of suspending their services to WikiLeaks such as MasterCard and Visa is the subject of many of Thursday's stories, including front page pieces in the Daily Mail, Independent and Financial Times. Other items of interest for the British press include reports on Shell's actions in Nigeria, the health of convicted Lockerbie bomber Abdel Baset al-Megrahi, and domestic disagreements over the UK's nuclear deterrent.
- 2. There is only one mention of Canada in UK media stories today. Roxanne,

I met today with Jean-Maurice Moreau and some of his team to discuss the way ahead with respect to the Wikileaks Task Force. With the pace of postings to the Wikileaks website much less than we had originally expected it is time to think about re-sizing our operation. Today we discussed an interim approach followed by a more sustainable solution.

(a) Here is the current situation:

The Wikileaks Task Force is currently operating out of A2-217 with 15 standalone work stations, 4 SIGNET work stations, 2 C5 workstations, a secure scanner, shredder and a secure filing cabinet. We have IT/IM staff available at all times to do searches and provide technical support. We make use of a stand alone internet connection in the CST open area that monitors the Wikileaks website 24/7 for uploads and scans them for any Canadian content based on pre-selected search terms.

(b) Here is what is proposed:

(i) Interim Period (until mid to late January)

We move to D1-600 (by Wednesday or Thursday of this week) where there is an available space for 2 standalone workstations and a C5. A shredder is available as well as secure storage. A secure scanner will need to be made available.

Operationally, the system will work as follows:

- when documents are uploaded to the Wikileaks site they are automatically scanned and an alert is sent to Task Force Managers if there is Canadian content (current procedure).
- if after reviewing the documents the Task Force Managers consider that a review by subject matter analysts is required the appropriate division(s) or OGD points of contact are contacted (current procedure).
- instead of analysts coming to the Task Force room, the documents will be scanned and sent to them by C5. They will prepare their reports at their workstations (if required) and send to the Task Force for onward distribution (new procedure this essentially decentralizes the analysis and report preparation stage across the Department).
- Records keeping will continue to be done by the Task Force.
- (ii) Sustainable Solution (end January to ?)

AITC uploads the documents to C5 to which all divisions have access (Jean Maurice is preparing a proposal for review of this proposal by the CIO from a risk management perspective).

Along with the documents a web-based C5 browser is made available by which the documents can be searched.

A central Wikileaks 'Point of Contact' (or preferably several POCs within DFAIT) is alerted when there is a Wikileaks document upload. Upon reviewing the material the POC alerts the appropriate division(s) and asks

them to prepare a short preliminary analysis/review using the standard template.

This review is then sent out by the division using a standard distribution list supplemented by additional addressees as required (including OGDs) copying the POC and AIMG for records keeping purposes.

This process remains in place until all the Wikileaks documents have been released.

This proposal has the advantage of de-centralizing the review, analysis and distribution steps now currently done by the Task Force. The POC would need to be identified and given overall ownership and responsibility for ensuring the process worked.

1. The Guardian continues to play the WikiLeaks story prominently and extensively, both online and in print. Other British newspapers and broadcasters remain interested in so-called cyber-warfare, the ongoing troubles of Julian Assange, and the Vatican, but are increasingly focused on other domestic and international news stories. The WikiLeaks stories which ran in recent days examined topics ranging from corruption in Kazakhstan to the unsolved murder of Alexander Litvinenko in London.

2. What mentions there are of Canada occur in passing or as background to a larger story. The Guardian mentions Mr. Justice Peter Cory's investigation of collusion by the UK government in the murder of Belfast lawyer Pat Finucane. The story alleges that MI5 holds files on the case which could be of use to an inquiry - which the newspaper reports was recommended by Cory.

Objective: to conduct a review of current DFAIT systems and procedures for the secure handling of classified information in electronic format (i.e. classified material transmitted on the C5 system). The review will provide a risk assessment of current practices and make recommendations for additional measures to safeguard classified information generated and conveyed via the C5 system. Neither Top Secret nor Protected categories of information will be considered in the present study as these are subject to different systems and standards.
- 2. Process: the consultant will conduct interviews with key DFAIT officials responsible for the classified IT/IM systems and the security of the information stored or processed on them. In light of the results of these interviews, the consultant will draw upon his own experience as a career Foreign Service Officer and as DFAIT's Departmental Security Officer (2007-2010) to formulate the assessment and recommendations.
- 3. Product: A report containing the assessment and recommendations of the consultant will be delivered to the project manager or his/her designate by December XX, 2010.

The Wikileaks Task Force continues to monitor all documents uploaded to the Wikileaks site for content that is relevant to Canada. As of this morning basic key word searches have been completed on all the 1634 documents that Wikileaks has released. We remain at 9 as the number

that are of interest from a Canadian perspective with all of those having been released in the early stages of this process. Short summaries/analyses have been done on these documents and forwarded to the responsible DFAIT divisions and OGDs.

Given that the pace at which Wikileaks has been releasing the documents to their site is far below what was originally anticipated we have re-sized the Task Force accordingly. We have moved from the A2-217 Task Force Ops Centre where we had 15 stand-alone work stations and dedicated IM/IT staff, to D1-600 with 3 work stations and staff on standby.

So as not to add to unnecessary e-mail traffic we have decided that Situation Reports will now only be issued on an as needed basis defined as when there is something directly relevant to Canada and Canadian interests to report.

Over the course of the holidays and into January the Task Force will continue to review Wikileaks documents as required. If specific subject matter assistance is required we will contact the appropriate DFAIT division(s) and or Points of Contact in OGD(s). For OGDs please ensure your POC is correct - see attached list. Any changes should be sent to the Wikileaks Task Force e-mail address.

For February and beyond our IM/IT officials are currently looking at longer term, more sustainable solutions should that be necessary. More on that in January.

I have the monitor set up to download all the cables from the NY Times site. So here is how it works:

- Every 5 minutes it checks the nytimes cable web site, and checks which cables are posted there
- Compares the list of posted cables to what we have already downloaded
- If there are any new cables, it runs them through the priority email script looking for the same triggers as the Wikileaks script
- Emails are sent for the same reasons as the other script
- Cables are not downloaded, it is expected that the person wanting to read them can go to the NYTimes web site and view them

Cables will still be downloaded and alerted like before once they appear on the official Wikileaks site.

On the NYT site, they categorize the cables themselves, so I have added the "Canada" category as a new priority for alerting.

At this time, there are 2 cables on the NYT site that we don't already have, but they are not of interest to us.

Let me know if this is the workflow you want, and if there are any changes you want made to it.

Robert Mugabe, Zimbabwe president, on Friday threatened to nationalise companies from western nations that had imposed "smart sanctions" against his Zanu-PF party.

Addressing the party's annual congress in the eastern city of Mutare, the president said that the more than 400 western companies in Zimbabwe could not be allowed to continue to operate freely while their governments imposed sanctions on the country.

"In some cases we must read the riot act to the British and their American companies, that unless their countries

remove the sanctions then we will go all the way to 100 per cent ownership," Mr Mugabe said.

His Zanu-PF party is pushing hard for the immediate implementation of the country's indigenisation law making it mandatory for all foreign-owned firms with assets in excess of \$500 000 to dispose of at least 51 percent of their shares to indigenous Zimbabweans.

In an overt threat to his coalition partner, prime minister Morgan Tsvangirai of the Movement for Democratic Change, Mr Mugabe said Zimbabweans who called for sanctions on the country should be charged with treason, which carries a death sentence. "There should be a legal side to it. We need to advocate for a law that punishes those who call for sanctions, as doing so makes it treasonous. That is treason, to call on the enemy to punish our people," he said

This was a reference to a **WikiLeaks revelation** that Mr Tsvangirai had told the US government that while he would publicly appeal for the lifting of sanctions against Zimbabwe, privately he would urge Western nations – the US, EU, Australia, New Zealand and Canada to maintain the sanctions. Since the publication of the WikiLeaks revelation the state media, which supports Mr Mugabe, has been calling for Mr Tsvangirai's prosecution.

The president promised to dissolve the government of national unity, established in February 2009 with the two wings of the MDC, saying that it had always been agreed that the unity government would have a life of only two years.

He said he would call fresh elections early next year, which means that he has decided against waiting for the completion of a new constitution as **agreed with his two coalition partners** in September 2008.

Both wings of the MDC are opposed to **new elections** under the existing constitution because, they say, these would be seriously flawed and result in widespread violence and intimidation. Mr Tsvangirai has said he will boycott elections unless there are cast iron guarantees of international monitors and effective measures to prevent violence.

In the past few days a line of WikiLeaks stories have originated from Norway's largest newspaper Aftenposten (equivalent of the Globe and Mail) and in a number of regional papers affiliated to Aftenposten. Aftenposten's source is Svenska Dagbladet. Aftenposten and the regional papers have a group of journalists assigned to WikiLeaks going through the documents and one of them contacted us this afternoon informing us that there will be a story published in Norwegian media reporting on a cable from the US embassy in Ottawa following a meeting between the US Ambassador to Canada and former Minister of the Environment Jim Prentice. This meeting took place this summer shortly after Minister Prentice visited Norway. Mission has not seen the the story yet, but journalist said that in the meeting Mininster Prentice had expressed grave concern over the Norwegian public perception of the Norwegian Oil company Statoil (70% owned by the Government of Norway) investment in the Alberta Oilsands. Minister Prentice had preceeded to inform the US Ambassador that he believed that the Canadian government had been caught off-guard with regards to the international criticism of the oilsands operations and not reacted swiftly enough to counter it. He felt that Canada's image as an environmental leader was tarnished and that he was considering taking steps to introduce national legislation to reduce impact of operations.

Will revert with more when the story is published.





1.0 Introduction and Scope:

The Wikileaks affair of December 2010, with its attendant unauthorised disclosure of massive quantities of official U.S. Government information (over 250,000 State Department cables) has highlighted the risk run by large organisations in safeguarding their information. This report reviews the current arrangements for the protection of classified information at Foreign Affairs and International Trade Canada (DFAIT) and examines possible means of mitigating the risk of such a large scale unauthorized release of DFAIT classified information. Given time restrictions, the scope of this report is limited to classified information (i.e. material classified at the Confidential or Secret level in accordance with Government of Canada security policy) in electronic format. This category of classified information was considered to be the chief area of concern for surreptitious extraction. Designated information (i.e. distinguished by the Protected A, B or C label) and Top Secret classified material are governed by separate policies and are processed on separate electronic systems. The focus in this report is on the classified information generated and transmitted on DFAIT's C5 system and stored in the Department's classified registry. This category of classified information encompasses the bulk of diplomatic correspondence which, if disclosed would constitute an injury to the national interest and the conduct of Canada's diplomacy.



5.0 Conclusion: In considering how best to protect DFAIT from an unauthorised disclosure of classified information on a scale akin to that suffered by State Department in the Wikileaks affair, it is important to retain a sense of proportion and distinction between the systems of the two foreign ministries. The DFAIT C5 system is not configured in such a way as to permit access by tens of thousands of users to the total contents of a classified repository. With the exception of the Information Management Service Officers and the System Administrators possessing C5 domain access privileges, C5 account holders are restricted to the information housed on their account and on the I-drive common to the division where they work. While a determined and savvy insider will be able to circumvent security controls and extract some classified information, there are ways to mitigate the general risk of this occurring. A combination of technological refinements and human-centred measures represent the best basis for improving the overall security of information posture for DFAIT. As a department dependent on the production and circulation of information, it is crucial to avoid a "swinging pendulum" approach to disturbing developments elsewhere. The best way forward is to promote a sound and integrated foundation of security and professional responsibility on the part of DFAIT staff and to provide them with the right tools for the secure conduct of their work.

Fears vetting is political hush-up

THE era of terrorism has helped drive greater secrecy across government, with a record 170,000 Australians holding security clearances.

ASIO now conducts one-third more security assessments than it did five years ago, reflecting the growing number of people who are being given access to official secrets and restricted areas.

Much of this reflects the growth in the scale of the country's counter-terror apparatus, including tighter security at airports and maritime ports and expanded intelligence and police operations.

But it raises questions about whether the trend towards greater secrecy goes beyond genuine national security issues and extends to the protection of politically sensitive information.

Figures provided to The Australian by the Attorney-General's office reveal for the first time that there are "170,000 active security clearance holders at Confidential or above".

This national number was compiled by the new Australian Government Security Vetting Agency, launched in October this year as a centralised agency to conduct security checks for all levels of government.

Although there is no previous national number to compare it with, a growing number of people are being cleared to access sensitive information.

Last financial year, the Australian Security Intelligence Organisation completed 22,343 personal security assessments compared with 17,117 in 2004-05, a rise of one-third in five years.

ASIO says these assessments cover "the issuing of passports, granting of visas, granting of access to sensitive government information (security clearances) and access to restricted areas such as ports and airports and sensitive goods such as ammonium nitrate".

Security clearances require the AGSVA to investigate the background, character and personal values of the applicant and their partners. The Community and Public Sector Union said the sharp increase in people being forced to undergo security assessments and clearances was a worrying trend.

"Public servants understand the need for reasonable national security clearances," CPSU assistant national secretary Louise Persse told The Australian.

"(But) being assessed for higher-level security clearances can be a lengthy, unsettling and intrusive process.

"We would not want to see a situation where people with the skills and capacity to do important work for the community decide not to apply."

There is no central agency in Australia that monitors the number of classified documents held by each Australian government agency. But the government denies being vulnerable to a WikiLeaks-style security leak, because Australia has more stringent safeguards than the US.

In Australia, classified information is not shared as openly between agencies as it was in the US, where army private Bradley Manning was able to access US State Department cables and is suspected of passing them on to WikiLeaks.

"Access to Department of Foreign Affairs cables is granted on a strictly need-to-know basis," a spokesman for the Attorney-General's Department said.

"A strong business case must be made for an individual to demonstrate the requirement to access DFAT cables and must be directly applicable to their work."

The Attorney-General, Robert McClelland, declined to say whether he wanted to see a reduction in the number of classified documents, saying the security of those documents was the government's prime concern.

"It is critical to Australia's national interest and the secure operation of government that there are strong procedures in place in regards to sensitive information," he told The Australian.

Reporting on the WikiLeaks story in Zimbabwe has beer focused on partisan political interests and largely on the leaked cables that criticise the leader of the MDC-T (former Opposstion) Morgan Tsvangirai. However, there have been two developments related to the leaks that we may see reflected elsewhere.

In the first development Grace Mugabe, the wife of President Robert Mugabe, has sued one of the prominent weekly newspapers for USD15 million compensation after the paper published WikiLeaks allegations that she was linked to diamond smuggling in the country. Cables from the US embassy in Harare released by the website claimed Grace Mugabe was among senior Zanu PF and government officials reaping massive profits from the smuggling of diamonds in the country. Mugabe's lawyer calls the report 'false, scandalous, malicious and bent on damaging her reputation'. The US cables were written by the former US ambassador to Zimbabwe, James McGee, in November 2008. This is the first announced lawsuit in Zimbabwe related to the WikiLeaks.

In a related development, this week Zimbabwe's Attorney General announced plans to set up a Commission to investigate possible treason charges against Zimbabweans who have been reported in US cables as providing to US diplomats information that is potentially damaging to the state. The move appears to be targeting Prime Minister Tsvangirai who is quoted by US officials in some of the cables released by WikiLeaks. The Commission is intended to establish whether information within the reports in WikiLeaks, amounts to any breach of the Constitution: "The WikiLeaks appear to show a treasonous collusion between local Zimbabweans and the aggressive international world, particularly the United States". Treason charges against the leader of the Opposition would certainly complicate an already volatile political situation in Zimbabwe.







OTTAWA _ A leaked U.S. State Department cable suggests a ransom was paid for the release of two Canadian diplomats taken hostage in Niger two years ago.

The May 2009 cable released by online whistleblower WikiLeaks says a Libyan official told the U.S. ambassador in Tripoli that two Canadian officials were released ``in return for a ransom payment."

The cable was written just weeks after diplomats Robert Fowler and Louis Guay were released after being kidnapped by al-Qaida's North African wing in December 2008. It does not detail how much was paid in ransom or who might have paid it.

The federal government has maintained that Canada did not pay a ransom for the release of the two men, but the prime minister also hasn't said if anyone else did.

Stephen Harper has said the governments of Mali and Burkina Faso negotiated the release of the men, but never elaborated on whether they paid ransom or agreed to a prisoner exchange.

Musa Kusa, who was Libya's foreign minister at the time, said in the cable that such payments were ``unfortunate and only increased the strength of al-Quaida."

Fowler, Guay and their driver disappeared when returning from a visit to a gold mine. Fowler was on assignment as the UN's special envoy to Niger at the time.

Fowler was a senior adviser to several prime ministers, starting with Pierre Trudeau, and played a leading role in thwarting the trade of so-called blood diamonds in Angola.

Western intelligence officials in Algeria said in February that they believe the UN diplomats were initially abducted by local gunmen, bandits or Tuareg rebels, and later traded to the al-Qaida group.

Al-Qaida in the Islamic Maghreb is an Algeria-based militant group that joined Osama bin Laden's terror network in 2006 and conducts dozens of bombings or ambushes each month.

In February 2009, the group claimed in an audio tape played on the Al-Jazeera television network that it was holding the two Canadians hostage.

It made no demands at that time, but in the past has received ransoms for western tourists kidnapped in the vast sub-Saharan region.

Karen, Darcee, Natalja,

As you know, DFAIT is establishing an internal task force to effectively respond to media attention, requests from the Ministers' offices (MINA, MINT and MSFA), and to proactively assess the seriousness of this wikileak for Canadian interests. As this will affect US interests around the world, we are also issuing a notice to the Department, to Heads of Missions and to Deputy Ministers in other government departments, and are alerting provinces through our federal-provincial network.

PCO/Communications has asked that DFAIT lead on the communications until further notice.

While we are putting the systems in place to deal promptly and efficiently with the multitude of requests stemming from this publication, we will be facing a number of challenges related to:

- the magnitude, breadth and sudden nature of the document 'dump';
- expected difficulties in accessing saturated wikileaks website;
- preventative security measures to prevent contamination (viruses and malware) of our infrastructure (i.e. access to wikileaks from networks at DFAIT, as well as PCO and Public Safety, are blocked).

Appropriate mitigation measures have been taken, as we are very mindful of the forthcoming media attention and of the need to be able to respond promptly and accurately on a range of issues. For example, our communications bureaux and desks across the departments with subject-matter expertise are mobilized and on standby. We will also be downloading the entire content of 'wikileaks' onto standalone computers in our operations centre, and will be working securely and with unfettered access to the content of the website. We are also developing 'key word' searches to sift through the material as soon as it is made available. We will obviously ensure that regular sitreps are provided to the Ministers' offices.

We will be providing a more detailed assessment of the way forward as soon as possible.

To: All employees at Headquarters, at missions and regional offices

Recent developments relating to the release of sensitive and classified information require us to remind everyone of their responsibilities and obligations regarding the control of classified information.

Serious consequences can result from the failure to protect sensitive information. Not identifying correspondence correctly, and the use of an inappropriate communication system may result in information being transmitted to those for whom it was not intended. The consequence could be damaged relations with our allies or key contacts that undercut our diplomacy. Each employee has an obligation to identify and adequately safeguard sensitive information, and to use the appropriate system when drafting and disseminating messages.

Access to protected and classified information is governed by the "need to know" principle. Employees who have committed security breaches either deliberately or through negligence will face sanctions, including administrative or disciplinary actions, and/or criminal charges as stipulated by the Security of Information Act.

Attached is information related to all of our obligations related to the protection of classified and sensitive information. It is encumbant on all of us to respect the Government Policy on Security. It is a fundamental responsibility of public service.

TEXT OF ATTACHMENT:

The Policy on Government Security requires employees to identify, clearly mark and safeguard information and assets when their unauthorized disclosure could reasonably be expected to cause injury to the national interest of Canada, or to private or other non-national interests.

As an employee, it is your responsibility to:

Determine the correct level of classification or protection of information;

Clearly mark all documents with the appropriate level of safeguarding;

Prepare, safeguard, store or dispose of information in a manner commensurate with the level of classification or protection of information; and

Use the appropriate electronic system to transmit, depending on the classification or level of protection assigned to a document. SIGNET D for unclassified and Protected A, and SIGNET C for Protected B, Protected C, Confidential and Secret.

The various levels of classified and protected information, with examples to assist you, follow:

SECRET Compromise of the information could reasonably be expected to cause serious injury to the national interest. The following are examples of SECRET level information: records of discussions of Cabinet or Cabinet committees; details of important international negotiations; scientific or technical developments relating to national defence or national security.

CONFIDENTIAL Compromise of the information could reasonably be expected to cause injury to the national interest. The following are examples of CONFIDENTIAL level information: record of discussions of interdepartmental committees; reports from missions or from Canada that may be of advantage to foreign powers or that might cause an injury to international relations.

PROTECTED C Compromise of the information could reasonably be expected to cause exceptionally grave injury to other interests. For example, this level of information could have an impact on the safety of individuals, it could be important commercial information or it could be related to law enforcement activities.

PROTECTED B Compromise of the information could reasonably be expected to cause serious injury to other interests such as information that is of solicitor-client privilege or a company's financial information. Serious injury is defined as that which has lasting harm or embarrassment that will have direct negative effects on an individual's career, reputation, financial position, safety, health or well-being.

PROTECTED A Compromise of the information could reasonably be expected to cause injury to other interests. For example, an exact salary figure or an employee's Social Insurance Number would be Protected A information.

Locally Engaged Staff have access to SIGNET D and may originate information up to and including Protected A. In exceptional circumstances, Locally Engaged Staff may see and originate Protected B information, with the Program Manager and Mission Security Officer approval, or Protected C information with Head of Mission and Mission Security Officer approval. Canada-based Staff use SIGNET D and C, depending on the classification of the document.

The Security and Intelligence Bureau (CSD) maintains a <u>Classification and Protection Guide</u> to assist you with this mandatory requirement. We urge you to review the Guide for information on how to properly classify and protect information and assets. Employees are also bound by the <u>Network Acceptable Use Policy</u> in their use of the electronic networks, both voice and data.

The Corporate Security Division (CSC) also offers a Security of Information training course to help you understand your obligations and to respond to any queries that you may have. Please contact CSC to register for the course or to obtain more information.

- preventative security measures to ensure the integrity of our network systems.

We are very mindful of the need to be able to respond promptly and accurately on a range of issues. Desks across the departments with subject-matter expertise have been engaged and will review relevant documents in as effective and efficient manner possible in light of the above challenges. I invite your organizations to work closely with relevant branches within DFAIT on issues of common interest.

Le MAÉCI a constitué un groupe de travail interne pour évaluer l'impact sur les intérêts canadiens et répondre aux demandes. Nous envoyons aussi un avis à l'ensemble de notre réseau de missions, et alertons nos autres partenaires au sein du Canada. Bien que nous mettions des systèmes en place pour répondre rapidement et efficacement aux demandes résultant de cette publication, nous ferons face à un certain nombre de défis liés à:

- le nombre de documents publiés à la fois et la nature et la portée des documents:
- les difficultés d'accès au site et la congestion attendue du site Wikileaks; et,
- mesures de sécurité préventives pour assurer l'intégrité de nos réseaux informatiques.

Nous sommes bien conscients du besoin de pouvoir répondre rapidement et avec exactitude aux demandes portant sur une étendue de dossiers. Les pupitres à l'échelle du ministère détenant l'expertise nécessaire ont été mobilisés et analyseront la documentation pertinente de la façon la plus efficace et efficiente possible, à la lumière des défis mentionnés. Nous invitons votre organisation à travailler étroitement avec les secteurs pertinents du MAÉCI, sur les enjeux d'intérêt commun.
