The program provides an opportunity for State National Guard Joint Force Headquarters to improve command and control and operational relationships with internal, regional civilian and military partners.















Scenario Update

- The Scenario has upgraded the strength of the earthquake from 6.3 to 7.2 Mw
- This change is to accommodate the large number of agencies and states participating in the exercise by making their involvement more plausible
- Expected Frequencies:
 - 5+ every 32 years
 - 6+ every 190 years
 - 7+ every 1,112 years

- Demonstrate the information flow and interagency coordination between Non-Governmental Organizations, local, state, and federal offices
- Demonstrate Continuity of Operations at the local, state and federal level
- Demonstrate integration and interoperability of private, local, state and federal resources

- Demonstrate ability to respond to a natural or manmade disaster in order to protect the citizens of Montana

Exercise Concept of Operations

Exercise Control

- The Vigilant Guard Team **Exercise Control Cell** (ECC) will operate from HAFRC. The ECC will send injects directly to its assigned exercise group. The ECC will coordinate operations to ensure all participants are meeting their exercise objectives and to deconflict issues as required.
- The <u>Simulation Cell</u> (SIMCELL) will also operate out of HARFC in close coordination with the Exercise Control Cell. Representatives in the SIMCELL will replicate units notionally playing in the exercise (e.g. a notionally deployed unit) or agencies notionally playing or have limited staff participation (e.g. one or two representatives are replicating the agency as a whole).
- <u>Data Collectors/Controllers</u> (DCCs) will be stationed at the different exercise venues to collect information for the After Action Review/Report (AAR) and monitor and facilitate exercise play.
- <u>Subject Matter Experts</u> (SMEs) will be called upon to observe, and when necessary, mentor blue players. Information from their observations will also be used in the AARs.



INJ030	Damage to Bridges	Media reports confirm that several bridges in Western Tennessee have been heavily damaged or destroyed. Bridge soleleved to be Impassable at this time include the Memphis' Arkansas Bridge (I-55), the Frisco Railmoad Bridge, and the Harahan Railroad Bridge. Both the Hernando Desoto Bridge in Memphis (I-40), and the Carruthersville Bridge (I-155) are standing, but have sustained heavy damage and are believed to be unsafe for any vehicle traffic. INJ031	HAZMAT Incident, I-40	A major hazardous materials event has been identified on I-40. A vehicle carrying an unknown quantity and type of flammable products was overturned during the New Madrid earthquake. The accident resulted in an explosion and several secondary accidents. News crews on scene report the accident has blocked all eastbound and westbound lanes of traffic on I-40. The accident is immediately east of Exit 24, near the Paul W. Barrett Memorial Parkway. INJ032	Train Derailment	Media reports indicate a multi-car train derailment within the Memphis city limits. Following the earthquake, a rail overpass collapsed at Park Avenue and I-240. An approaching 50+ car freight train was unable to brake and collapsed across the interstate. All north and southbound lanes of traffic are blocked. While no HAZMAT incidents have been associated with this crash, multiple fires are reported. Traffic in the area has been severely disrupted. INJ033	Air Traffic Control Issues	Memphis International Airport reports heavy damage to all runways at its facility. Runways 18.026c, 18.138R, 1878.03. and 91.77 require extensive repairs before returning to service. Airport officials are attempting to assess damage to fuel lines, while evacuating seven planes of various sizes straned on the tarmac. No injuries are crashes have been reported at this time. 


Scenario Overview

Initial damage estimates from earthquake Northeast of Helena suggest loss of life and destruction of property in Lewis and Clark, Jefferson, and Broadwater Counties. Critical infrastructure including roads, rails, power grids, water, sewage, and gas lines have all been significantly disrupted. Hazardous material incidents are also being reported. Hundreds of victims require medical treatment.



Exercise Scenario Overview





Response Challenges

• Transportation Infrastructure Degraded:

Destroyed, damaged or blocked

• Medical Facilities:

- Damaged or isolated with staff, power and water shortages; trauma facilities overwhelmed
- St. Peter's Hospital damaged

• Medical Requirements:

- 2000 need medical aid, up to 400 require hospitalization
- Approximately 60 life threatening injuries and over 100 deaths

Collapsed Buildings:

- Thousands trapped
- Area fires and flooding complicate response

• Debris:

- Estimated .25 million tons of debris
- Abandoned/damaged vehicles on primary and secondary roads.





Response Challenges

• Temporary Shelters & Emergency Relief:

 Over 3000 homes displaced; 1000 require temporary sheltering

• Flooding:

 Broken water mains flood streets causing evacuations; Dams sustain damage and threaten additional flooding

• Utilities:

- Communications, power, water, and sanitation services are unavailable in large service areas.
- 10K without water and 16K without electricity
- Ruptured gas lines lead to multiple fires

HAZMAT Events:

- HAZMAT challenges on roads, rail, waterways and at damaged businesses.
- Montana Rail Link reports train derailment;
 ConocoPhillips reports pipeline rupture, oil spill.

Relief Supply Management:

 Food and water inventories depleted. Re-supply hampered by transportation infrastructure damage








Field Training Exercise

Information Flow

- Incident Commander (IC) sends RFI/RFA to County/City EOCs to meet incident command needs.
- Local EOC send RFIs/RFAs to MT DES EOC for needs that cannot be met by municipality non-military resources.
- If DES believes the MT National Guard (NG) can fill a capability need then DES sends the mission request to the MT Joint Operation Center (JOC).





Field Training Exercise

FTX Injects

- Controllers and Incident Commanders (IC) at the field training exercise will have situational injects that may be introduced.
- All situational injects will be introduced by the IC after consulting with the On-Site Lead Controller and the Exercise Control Cell.
- Situational injects are designed to enhance training efforts, NOT disrupt them.

Venue: St. Peter's Hospital

Location: 2475 E Broadway St, Helena, MT

Exercise Dates: TBD

Description: Resulting from the earthquake, St. Peter's begins to experience excessive patient load. 4-6 hours into the event, 80-100 victims overwhelm hospital staff, requiring the hospital to activate surge capacity plans, control building access, send patients to other hospitals, and request additional medical assets from the county.


